Recognized as honorable mention All District from Spearman was the other two starting members of the Lynxettes, junior Ginger Pearson and senior Lisa Cazarez.

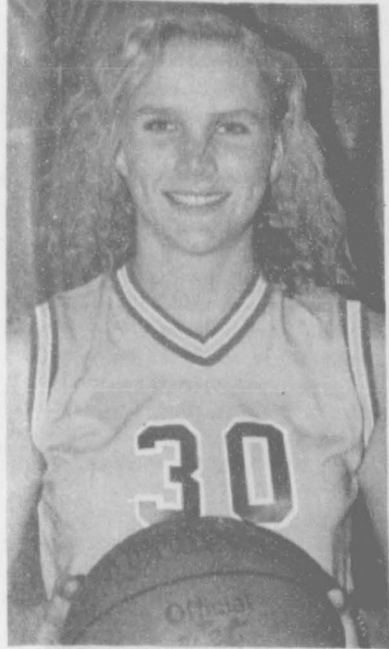
The Lynxettes won the district 1-AA girls basketball crown this past season as well as the bi-district title. They lost their bid for the area crown in a 44-43 squeaker

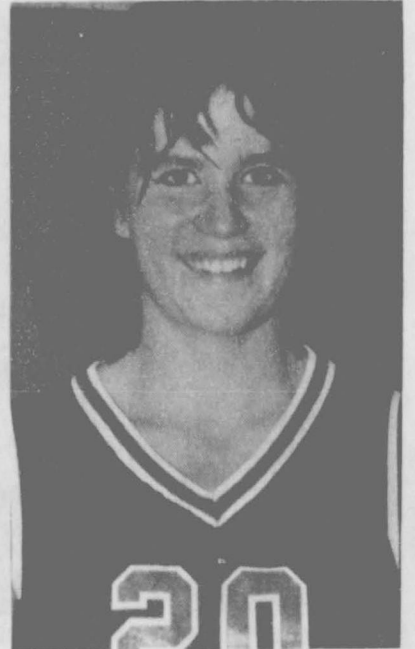

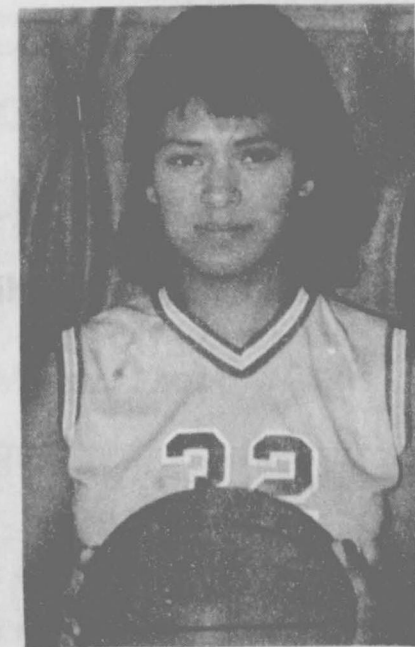

In preparation for Super Tuesday voting . . .

Hansford absentee balloting light

Absentee balloting for the March 8 Super Tuesday presidential preference primary seems to be drawing little interest in Hansford County with only five Republican and three Democratic ballots cast through Friday morning.

Absentee balloting will continue at the Hansford county courthouse in Spearman through next Friday with the March 8 vote now less than 10 days away.

This is the first year for Texas to join the Super Tuesday list of states who ballot on the second Tuesday of March.

Traditionally, Texas voters have cast their ballots on the first Saturday in May. Texas legislators voted this past summer to move the state's primary to the second Tuesday in March date to coincide with other Southern states primary voting.

Filings for Hansford city, schools light

Filings for city and school board positions open in Gruver and Spearman remained quiet by week's end with only one filing for three open positions on the city of Spearman commission and two SIDS incumbent filings.

There have been no filings for the one city councilmember position in Gruver, nor for the two spots on the GISD board.

Bob Pearson is the first person to file for Mayor in Spearman, a post being vacated this year by long-time Mayor Ralph Blodgett.

Both councilmember incumbents, Ed Garner and Jim Nicholson have indicated they will not seek re-election to those posts.

On the Spearman ISD school board, incumbents Mike Garnett and Joe Clement have filed their intent to seek re-election there.

In Gruver, incumbents Billy Logsdon, Jr. and Dick Murray have indicated they will not seek re-election this year.

Ila Jo Hart, Gruver city councilmember has stated in open meeting that she would not seek re-election, but has been out of town and unavailable for comment to reconfirm that.

Political hopefuls have until March 23 to file for the different offices in the two Hansford county cities.

Bid requests high for PDRA construction

Up to 30 bids may be received for construction of an earthen dam on the Palo Duro draw as a March 16 deadline for bid opening draws near.

Palo Duro River Authority engineers in Ft. Worth have had requests from 30 different contractors for plans and specifications of the new dam which will be located in Hansford county.

"We don't know that all of them will bid," notes PDRA general manager Johnnie Lee. "But there has been a great deal of interest in the project."

Four different firms have visited the site of the proposed dam with another planning a visit early this week to view the construction site.

Once bids are opened March 16 in the Spearman high school auditorium, the bids will be sent to PDRA engineers in Ft. Worth to make certain they conform to bid specifications.

Once the bids are certified by the engineers they will be returned to the Spearman-based water authority for awarding of the bids, a process which could take another

ference, voters in the primary balloting for both the Republican and Democratic primaries will decide on other federal, state and local races to represent the two parties.

Contested races getting the most attention in Hansford county are U.S. Senator, state senator, and 84th district attorney.

All absentee balloting through next Friday takes place in the Hansford county courthouse in Spearman.

Actual balloting on primary election day will be handled in voting stations across Hansford county.

For the Republican party, voting precinct one will be at the courthouse in Spearman while voting precincts two, three and seven will go to the east door of the Gruver Community Bible Church.

Voting precinct four will be at the Gruver county barn and voting precinct five will be at the Spear-

School veteran hired as GISD superintendent

A veteran school administrator with 12-years experience was hired to head up the Gruver Independent School District during a special session of the GISD board Thursday evening in Gruver.

Tom Cathey was hired as the new GISD superintendent and will assume those duties on or before April 4.

He is currently serving as assistant superintendent of schools at Pampa where he has held that position for four years.

Prior to that Cathey served as business manager of the Floydada ISD for eight years.

The 47-year old administrative veteran holds a BS in mathematics from West Texas State University in Canyon with a Masters of Education, also from WTSU.

He attended Texas Tech University in Lubbock for one year on a National Science Institute grant.

Originally from Haskell, Cathey taught school in Stinnett for five years before going to Floydada where he taught classes for six years, then served as an assistant principal there for a year before taking the business manager position.

He served as interim superintendent at the Pampa ISD for a 8-month period last year. The Gruver ISD superintendent's position is his first roll to fully head up a school district.

Thursday's action by the GISD school board concluded a 3-week search to replace former school superintendent Chester Juroska who resigned earlier this month.

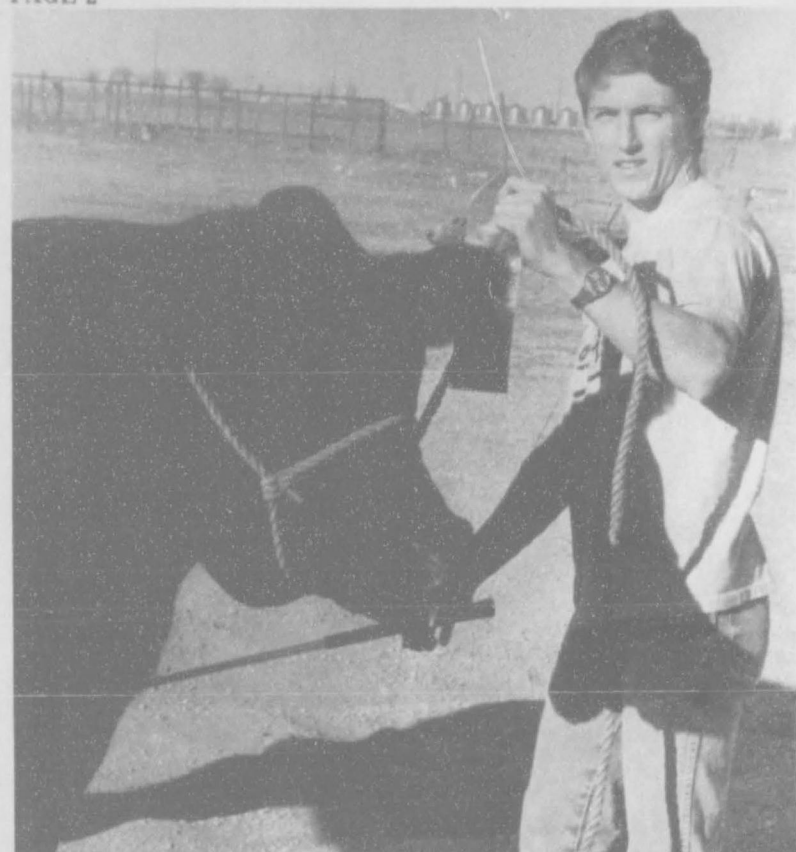

These booster signs were made by individuals to help promote their children. This is something we can all understand and relate to.

The loss of the signs dampens enthusiasm simply because we become more aware of their absence than we do their existence.

If you are aware of somebody with these signs, please think how your children would feel and ask that those individual return the signs.

It would be appreciated and, again, no questions will be asked. The people who made the signs only want them back. And, that's fair enough.

America expects a lot out of its leaders. Sometimes they expect too much. Especially when they expect

them to be above the worldly temptations that we "common folk" are surrounded by daily.

Yet, as Americans, we seem to have a different set of standards for our political and religious leaders.

Oliver North stood up and told the truth after he was caught in an embarrassing political scandal now known as the Iran-Contra Affair.

When asked if he would do it again under similar circumstances, he said he would. And he became an overnight hero.

Religious leader Jimmy Swaggart got caught doing some of the very things he preaches against.

He stood before his family, his congregation, indeed, before the world, apologized and asked for forgiveness from everyone, including God.

Many have forgiven him. Many more are condemning him. Seems if he were a political leader instead of a religious leader, we'd probably elect him president.

It's not make to say who is right or who is wrong and that's not something which needs to be attempted in a newspaper column. Especially on something as sensitive or volatile as politics or religion.

What I can't decide is whether to be confused or amazed -- not at North or Swaggart, but at the public's reaction to the two. Neither did more than give in to human temptation.

two to four weeks.

The bid could be awarded by the April regular PDRA board meeting on the 12th or sooner in a special called session if they are certified earlier than expected by the Ft. Worth engineers.

Once the bid is awarded, Lee expects actual construction to begin some 30 days later.

"Actual construction could begin as early as the first of May," he notes, "We're as anxious as anybody to get work started on the dam."

Once the dam is completed, it will eventually store some 60,900 acre feet of water for use by member cities of the Palo Duro Water Authority.

Member cities include Spearman, Gruver, Stinnett, Dumas, Sunray and Cactus. The reservoir will also act as a recreation area.
