## Gounty School Land Brings

 $\$ 2.35$ Per. Acre.The Hon. Commissioner's Court of Lynn county, conveined Monday February 12, and continued until Thursday evening when they took a recess until Saturday when they will finish a verry heavy session of the court.
Monday was passed attending to regular routine business, receiving and approving reports, treasurer's, sheriff's road overseer's and others. It was early decided to put off considering the school land business until Wednesday. It was rumored that the court was about evenly dided as to whether it would be advisable to sell the land now or not, and as Lynn county is fortunate enough to have commissioners and a judge who all have their own opinions, think for themselves and vote for what they think best for the county, there were quite a number of interested spectators in attendance most of the time.
Tuesday, the report of the two juries of view for the road to run southeast and then south and the one that run from it, east, were received, but as parties along both roads put in clams for damages aggregating a out $\$ 2000$, the com missionets decided to pay the costs already incured, something like $\$ 51$, charge it to experience, and wait until the citizens wanted the roads enough to stand some of the cost themselves.

After a great deal of cancusing all day Wednesday and most of Thursday, the commissioners voted 5 unanimously to accept Mr. Dalmonts last bid, and the land is sold 50 to him for $\$ 2.35$ per acre, on 40 years time at 5 per cent paid anually in advance. This means some5 thing over two thousand dollars a o vear for our schools for 40 years o Mr. Dilmoat gave a check for o $\$ 1,693.71$, the interest for this year
less the unused lease money. The 5 check to remain in the bank untii o the papers are examined and approved by Mr. Dalmont's lawyers

The "Cultus" ministry has Ju: pubilished a statement with referen. to the cases of persons bitton by men doga which have come to the knowl doga which have come to the know! odge of the authorities during 190,

The 307 person3 Ived in elght different provincese- 29 . them in eactern Prussia, -22 oast Pruasia and Silasia, wes ern aet Puala Thus Rusta is agsie alose to Russia. Thes Russia is agati shown to be the breeding place of thit plague. $O$ those bitten 281 proseedel to the insiltute for infectious ciseasas and were vaccinated. Fcur of them died of hydrophobla and one recovered after a silght attack. Deaths took place on the thirty-3ighth, inty-sixth one hundred and tenth and one hundred and thirty-ifth daye, reapective 1y, after the blte.
Vaccination has not proved ar abso utely certuin remedy, even when ap plied right after the bite. The atatis tics show, however, that of 281 persons vaccinated only four died; that is ont and one-half per cent.; while of those not vaccinated but treated med ically six per cent. died, and of thoee neither vaccinated nor treated 11 per cent. died.
"In view of these figures," the statement proceeds, "it is earneatly to be recommended that all percons having the misforiune to be bitten by doge either mad or suspected of madness at once submit to vaccination. The value of such vaccination is being more and more recognized.
