## Rotary Governor visits Spearman





"It seems our biggest advertisers are people who come one year and return the following years bringing friends and relatives with them," Mrs. Richard Sell said. "We often have people express surprise at the quality and quantity of our Show," she continued.

The Show is sponsored by the Golden Spread Antique Machinery Association which was formed for the purpose of presenting the Show as a means of education and appreciation for our agricultural heritage.

Horse drawn equipment, antique tractors, cars, trucks, and steam engines are just a part of the Show. There seems to be something of interest for everybody.

A parade of the machinery actually being driven past the grandstands in review with information given on each vehicle is featured both Saturday and Sunday beginning at 1:30 p.m. The parade lasts about 2 hours and concludes with old-time wheat thrashing. John Deere is the feature tractor this year.





## New Low Impact Class at "Y"

The new low-impact aerobic classes offered at the Y.M.C.A. are proving to be extremely popular. A mens and womens class is offered Wednesdays and Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 4:15 to 5:00.

Low impact aerobics is fast becoming one of the major focal points in the field of aerobic fatness classes. These classes do not involve the jumping and pounding that many people are finding destructive to the all-important joints of the body.

While keeping the feet low to the floor, participants use more extensive arm work to keep their heart rates up in their Target Range. This also provides an excellent upper body workout at the same time - toning and shaping the muscles of the arma, back and chest.

Although low impact aerobics first began because of the rise in joint injuries caused from high impact aerobics, its quick spread has pointed out many other types of participants and uses. Overweight people who want to have fun exercising and who cannot walk regularly outside because of bad weather; older people who are healthy but who want to keep the wear and tear on their joints down; people with arthritis or other joint problems who are getting the "o.k" from their doctor to participate; and now, even people with no problems at all are starting to realize that you do not have to jump off the floor or jog to get an effective aerobic work out. Also people who want to exercise more than 3 times a week are showing up, mainly to give their feet, shins, and legs a rest from jarring and overuse.

Beginners will do the squats, lunges, side reaches, etc., with comfortable shorter movements and will keep the arms lower. Experienced class members will do deeper, more exaggerated movements and may wear light wrist weights. Just as many calories are burned and just as much cardiovascular fitness is attained as in a high impact class as long as members keep their heart rate up in their Target Range for 20-25 minutes.

In order to keep all class members healthy and well, they are asked to fill out a health questionnaire and the teacher, Wanda Archer, measures fat to muscle ratio which will be used to compare to another measurement to be taken in November. This will help class members to know if they've

## PUBLIC NOTICE BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 4, 1986

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 1** ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 15 proposes a constitutional amendment that would permit the legislature to provide by general law for the apportionment of the value of railroad rolling stock among the counties in which the property of the railroad is located for purposes of property taxation, and would delete the requirement that the Comptroller participate in making the allocation. To comply with both statutory and constitutional law, the apportionment currently is being made by the State Property Tax Board in conjunction with the Comptroller.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to allow the legislature to provide by general law for the apportionment of the value of railroad rolling stock among counties for purposes of property taxation."

#### PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 33 pro poses a constitutional amendment that would replace the constitution-al requirement that the subject of a bill be expressed in its title with a mandate that each house of the legislature adopt rules of procedure that would require the subject of each bill to be expressed in its title in a manner that gives the legislature and the public reasonable notice of that subject. Determining compli-ance with the rule would be the responsibility of the legislature. Cur-

rently, a law is invalidated if a court finds its caption is defective. The amendment would provide that past and future enactments may not be held void on the basis of an insufficient title.

The amendment also would eliminate the suggestion that the state's laws be revised every ten years, and instead would provide for continuing revision of state laws.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment requiring each house to include in its rules of procedure a rule that each bill contain a title expressing the bill's subject, and providing for the continuing revision of state laws."

#### PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 73 proposes a constitutional amendment that would permit the Legislature to authorize any county, city, town, or other political subdivision to use public funds or credit to pay insurance premiums on nonassessable life, health, or accident policies. Due to the prohibition in the constitution against the lending of credit and granting of public money, political subdivisions currently are prohibit-ed from becoming shareholders in associations such as mutual-insurance companies, in which policy-holders are shareholders. A nonassessable mutual insurance policy does not allow a company to raise capital by assessing the policy-holder an extra amount on a pre-

mium. This amendment will allow mutual insurance companies and stock companies to bid for life and health group policies of political subdivisions. Public liability will be limited to the payment of premums specified in the contract.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment al-

lowing political subdivisions the opportunity to engage in and transact business with authorized mutual insurance companies in the same manner as with other insurance companies."

#### PROPOSITION NO. 4 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 4 proposes a constitutional amendment that would repeal the prohibition against branch banking by state banks and would allow state banks and national banks domiciled in this state to establish and operate banking facilities at locations within the county or city where they are domi-ciled. The amendment would also authorize the Legislature to permit a state bank or a national bank domiciled in this state to engage in business at more than one place if it acquires a failed state bank or national bank domiciled in this state.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to provide that a bank may offer full service banking at more than one location within the city or county where its principal facility is located, subject to limitations

and restrictions provided by law."




