THANKSGIVING DAY in the United States is a day set apa
annually for the giving of thanks to God for the blessings The yerr. Origuly for the giving of thank th tod fod for the bessing a harvest then purpoete has become less specific, the festival still take plag late in the aytumn after the crops have been gathered. Indeed/1t is probably ah outgrowth of the harvest celebrations of Engly

The earliest harvest thanksgiving in the Ney World was kept by the Pilgrim Fathers a P Plymouth in 1621 , and Yas repeated often during that and the ensuing cenutry. This first thanksgiving came after the dreadful winter had passed, during whith almost half of the Pilgrim company died. Renewed hope had grown up with the summer. In the fall the corn crop was gathered, and Governor Bradford decreed a day of thanksgiving. Great vere the preparations; the few women in the colony spent days before boiling, baking and roasting, and even the children were bus, turning the roasts on the spits before the open fires. As guests there were more than fourscore friendly Indians, who brought as their strare of the feast wild turkeys and venison from the woods The tables were set out of doors, and the company sat about them as one big family. This first thanksgiving however, yas not me ely a feast, there were prayers and sermons and songs of praise; and three days had gone by before the Indian returned to heir forest and the colonists to their tasks.

From Plymouth the cus om spread to the other colonies, until in time the governor of each issued such a proclamation annually During the Revolutionary Wor eight special thanksgiving days were
olserved-after signal victofies or wonderful deliverances from danger. President Washing on isqued a general thanksgiving-day proclamation in 1789. In the spme year the Protestant Episcopal Church of America announce 1 fhe first Thursday in November as a
