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The Voting Question

CAMPUS controversy about the inclusion of a poll tax in the new student activity ticket is still heated. If the discussion accomplishes nothing else, it should serve at least to make two points clear.

still heated. If the discussion accomplishes nothing else, it should serve at least to make two points clear:

1. That vital legislation concerning the student body cannot be presented fully and satisfactorily at convocation under the present conditions.

2. That, since No. 1 is true, it follows that the practice of passing on a measure by a standing vote at convocation immediately after the verbal presentation of that measure should be abandoned in favor of the ballot vote.

Present physical conditions at convocation, such as insufficient capacity, poor accoustics and unsatisfactory seating arrangement make it impossible for the majority of students to hear the proceedings of the meetings and the words of the speaker when legislation is being proposed. Many students stand automatically when they see others rise, and do not realize they are casting a vote by doing so.

Anyone wishing to protest a measure cannot make himself heard, is not invited to the stage to speak, and has been known to be ignored by the presiding officer.

Again, the nature of the business to be brought up is seldom made public preceding convocation, and as a result the student body has no time to consider and discuss a measure before voting on it.

If the idea is to push through legislation by

If the idea is to push through legislation by the expedients of incoherent presentation and the standing vote, then the voting of measures at convocation by all means should be continued, as an interesting variation of the old game, "Follow the Lander".

But if the idea is to adopt only legislation which has been presented adequately and voted intelligently by a student body that has had both the opportunity of pondering the proposal and the privilege of voting by ballot, then the present method should be abolished as unfair and unwise.

If the new ticket had been accepted by the student body through the ballot vote, the present dissatisfaction would not have arisen, except among new students. As it is, few students feel they really consented to the adoption of the ticket in its present form.


