OUR MUCH NEEDED DORMITORIES

Quite a few of the students of the school were surprised to read in the local paper that the Public Works Association had granted a loan of \$650,000 to Texas Tech College for the construction of two dormitories. It was indeed a pleasant surprise for many. Several officials of the college knew of the work being done toward securing this loan, but were not in a position to give out any information about the project.

All of which means that at last Texas Tech is getting something that has been needed on the campus since the opening of its doors in 1925. Dormitories on the grounds of the college will solve several problems that have been present each year that the school has been in existence.

First of all, it is going to hold a large part of the student body to a closer bond of fellowship which does not exist in the various boarding houses. This alone is one of the biggest accomplishments to be achieved. Just think of 600 students housed together in two fine buildings with all modern conveniences and with one purpose in mind, that of getting an education. In attaining their educational desires they can also enjoy the close friendship that always is enjoyed when so many students are living in a clean environment with the proper kind of training laid before them. As it is today, the student body is scattered to all parts of the city and a quick mobilization call could only muster a small percent of them.


