## Tech Trackmen Place Second In Border Meet Tennis Team Wins Second In Games

Reynolds High Point Individual Entry As Raiders Lose To Tempe In Last Event

Tech's track and field team returned from the Border conference meet at Albuquerque where they took second place honors after bowing to a strong Tempe aggregation in the last event of the meet. The Red Raiders took five first, two second, five third and two fourth places for a total score of 42 5-6 points to 49 1-2 for the Sun Devils. Fleet Charley Reynolds successfully defended his Border conference 100 yard dash title, placed first in the 220 yard dash and ran the anchor lap on the winning mile relay team to cop individual scoring honors for the meet, with 11 1-4 points. He barely nosed out Joe Batiste, sensational six event man from Tempe who compiled 11 points even.

This meet marked the end of the established 12 years ago. "Beat the Wildcats" seemed to be the order of the day as every team participating put everything they had into an effort to break the one-school domination.




