As a topic for conversation, a subject for magazine articles, courtroom oratory and sometimes for sermons apparently there are few things discussed more than are college students. In trying to judge any group of in-dividual persons, it is difficult to give a fair estimates of what they are as a class. To do this the sentiment of the student body must express itself highly in favor of the teams.
