NoW that this term is a little more than half over and mid-semester reports are being sent to your parents, have you stopped to take inventory? Did you do as well as expected or are you wondering why you were reported unsatisfactory or failing in one or more subjects?

If you would stop to think just how you have spent your time for the past few days, perhaps this would give you a clue. The average student attends at least two movies a week, and an average of three hours a day are spent drinking cokes and talking to friends, which totals about 27 hours a week, for recreation.
