During the month of December Santa Anna did not receive much rain, only .01 inches.

The year of 1985 we received 21.94 inches of moisture, which is about 3 inches below average. Average moisture is 26 inches for this area of Texas.

In January Santa Anna received 6 inches of snow, February .07 inches of rain, March 3.50 inches, April 2.25 inches, May 3.35 inches, June 3.30 inches, July .50 inches, August .85 inches, September 3.96 inches, October 2.77 inches, November .75 inches and December .01 inches, making the total 21.94.

Highway Accident Takes Life Of Lubbock Man

A man was killed and his wife was injured when the tractor trailer he was driving hit a cow and overturned on U.S. 283, 7 miles south of Santa Anna at 1:30 a.m. Monday, December 30.

According to Highway Patrolman, Jay Moses, the truck was a 1979 Kenworth tractor towing a semi-trailer loaded with concrete blocks. Driver of the vehicle was Jimmie Lee Hull,

age 52, of Lubbock, who was killed in the accident. His wife, Anna Hull, age 57, was asleep in the sleeper compartment and escaped serious injury.

Witnesses stated that Hull swerved to miss the whiteface, black cow that had walked in front of the truck, but hit the animal anyway. The trailer jackknifed, overturning the

truck and scattering concrete blocks up and down the highway. The cab was crushed and the "jaws of life" were called from Coleman to help extricate Hull from the wreckage. He was pronounced dead at 4:30 a.m. by Justice of the Peace Gale Brock and transported to Henderson Funeral Home in Coleman.

Anna Hull was transported to

Overall-Morris Memorial Hospital in Coleman by a Henderson Funeral Home ambulance. She received bruises and abrasions and was admitted to the hospital for observation.

Assisting at the site of the accident were the Santa Anna Volunteer Fire Department and the Coleman Fire Department.

JANUARY 1985

The Santa Anna Funeral Home announce their opening and will provide emergency or transfer ambulance services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Santa Anna Funeral Home offers monument selections. The Santa Anna Elementary School was broken into and a AM-FM Cassette radio, valued at \$70, was taken from the Nurses office. Burned scraps of paper, apparently burned to see by, were found in the floor. Entry was also made into the high school, as there were scraps of burned paper found in the hall and in the annual staff room.

The Santa Anna FFA and 4-H Livestock Show was held January 5, 1985. Grand Champion Finewool Lamb winner was shown by Bradley Wise; Grand Champion Cross Breed winner was shown by Alonzo Hernandez; Grand Champion Medium Wool winner was shown by Bradley Wise; Grand Champion Southdown was shown by Ricky Hernandez; Grand Champion Market Steer was also shown by Ricky Hernandez and the Grand Champion Market Swine was shown by Russell Williams.

The City Council met Jan. 10 in regular session. In a special meeting held earlier, city employees were granted a 10 percent pay raise. Lone Star Gas asked for an increase. A police report was submitted for the year of 1984. A Park Board Committee was announced. Those on the Park Board Committee are Chairman Glenn Cook, Gary Freeman, Mary Gano, Earlene Scott and Pearl Wilson.

Tandy Howard joined the News Staff on January 17, 1985 as Advertising Manager, replacing James Harrison.

Mrs. C. D. Bruce was named Citizen of the Year on January 17, 1985 by the Chamber of Commerce, also receiving an award was Rob Cheaney. Speaker at the event was Harry Clark.

The Coleman County Telephone Cooperative announced the new Northern Telecom Digital Central Office system to go into effect. Instead of dialing only five numbers (Example: 8-3545) as before, we now have to dial all seven numbers of a listing, (Example: 348-3545). Calling long distance, you now call 1+Area Code+Number, instead of the 112+Area Code+Number.

Coyita Bowker and Roland Nicholas were named to Level II on the Career Ladder by local school administrators. Mrs. Bowker is a first grade teacher and has been with the school 14 years. Mr. Nicholas teaches high school math, computer math and physics and has been with the school 9 years.

FEBRUARY 1985

During February's regular City Council meeting it was noted that 17 fire plugs in the city needed repair or needed to be replaced and five cases had been filed through the Santa Anna Police Department.

April elections are approaching. Candidates for the Santa Anna School Board include Bill Martin, Gary Absher, Danny Kellar, Don Bible and Wade Jones. Bill Martin's and Max Eubank's school board positions are expiring. Joe Guerrero, Garland Morgan and John Pearce have filed to run for council positions to be vacated by Dickie Horner and Joe Guerrero. No one has filed to run for the mayor position to be vacated by Edd Hartman.

Alonzo Hernandez, Phillip Hernandez, Carrie Myers, and Shaine Myers have entered the Houston Livestock Show showing Market Steers. Also entering are Ricky Hernandez and Bradley Wise showing Market Steers and Lambs.

St. Willow Baptist Church observed the installation of a new pastor, Rev. R. L. Brown of Abilene.

A 1985 Kenworth driven by Ralph E. Harper of Dodge City, Kansas, overturned in the curve across from the Dairy Queen. The trailer being pulled was leased to Brunson Inc. and contained 42,000 pounds of swinging beef. In the last three years there has been six serious accidents.

John Pearce withdrew his application for city council position and filed to run for mayor of Santa Anna. Joe Guerrero and Garland Morgan have filed to run for city council positions. The race for Santa Anna School Board continues with only five men running.

MARCH 1985

Another candidate withdrew from the city council race to run for City Mayor, Joe Guerrero. Don Hosch has also filed to run for mayor. Two positions on the city council need to be filled with Garland Morgan, J. T. Avants, Wade Jones and Roy Buse running as candidates.

The Santa Anna Tennis Teams, coached by R. C. Smith, played with Coleman on Tuesday, March 5 and won with an overall score of 7 to 6.

Those running for School Board positions are current board member Bill Martin, Gary Absher, Danny Kellar, Wade Jones, Scott Patterson and Don Bible. Current board president, Max Eubank, is not seeking reelection.

During a called meeting of the city council and a special hearing on the Santa Anna City Budget held on March 21, Lone Star Gas Co. was granted a 6.63 percent increase for city gas users. The new rates will go into effect on April 3, 1985.

Mrs. Delma Blair will assume duties as Officer in Charge of the Rowena Post Office on April 6, 1985.

APRIL 1985

Polling places for the Santa Anna city elections and for the Santa Anna Independent School District have changed from those of recent years. Voters in the city election will cast their ballots at City Hall. The School Trustee election will be held at the Santa Anna Housing Authority building. Rose Bass is election judge of the school board election while Montie Guthrie III is election judge of the city election.

Polly Warnock is named as managing editor of the Santa Anna News. Mrs. Warnock is a native of Santa Anna, graduating from Santa Anna High School, and is now serving her second term as a trustee of the Santa Anna Independent School District.

An estimated \$700 to \$800 in damage was caused to tires on several pieces of equipment at the high school over the March 9 weekend. Tires on two riding lawnmowers and a FFA trailer were punctured with a knife through the side walls. A 10-year-old youth was apprehended and has been referred to the juvenile authorities.

Joe Guerrero is elected as Mayor of Santa Anna on April 6, 1985 with 237 votes. Garland Morgan with 298, and J. T. Avants, with 222 votes, were elected to fill the two positions on the city council.

In School Board elections, incumbent, Bill Martin returned to his position on the Santa Anna ISD board of trustees with a total of 136 votes. Danny Kellar gained the other trustee position with 140 votes. Members of the board serve three years.

The National Honor Society inducted five new members in a candlelight ceremony with Monique Spillman conducting the service with Roland Nicholas and Diane Wetzel being faculty sponsors. Inducted were Toni Yancy, senior; Alys Pelton and Jeanene Jones, juniors; Melissa Buse and Jeannie Langford, sophomores.

At the regular Board meeting of the Santa Anna National Bank the Board accepted the resignation of James C. Shelton as President and Director of the Santa Anna National Bank. At the same meeting, Joe Ed Wise was elected President by unanimous vote.

Santa Anna had a clean-up day with approximately 50 people helping. A large amount of trash and debris was collected and taken to the dump ground. A lunch of barbecue sandwiches with all the trimming was served to those helping.

Danny Siller, son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Siller and a senior student of Santa Anna High School, has recently signed a letter of intent to play football at Cisco Jr. College.

James Hartman has been selected as valedictorian of Santa Anna Junior High School with a 97.37 average. Holly Hoffman was selected as salutatorian with a 95.23 average. Eighth grade graduation will be held May 23.

The Whirlybirds will have their first session of the school year on Wednesday, October 2 at the Methodist Church annex. The Whirlybirds is for children in first thru third grades. This session will begin the ninth year for the Whirlybirds in Santa Anna.

OCTOBER 1985

The defensive unit of the Santa Anna worked their Black Magic for the fourth straight week as the Mounties shutout the Sterling City Eagles 17-0. This game opened district competition for the Mountaineers.

Linda Horner Simmons was elected as Coming Home Queen and Dosh T. McCreary was chosen as Ex-Student of the Year. Homecoming activities were held the weekend of October 11, 12, and 13. Jeanene Jones was chosen as Homecoming Queen and was escorted by Johnny Herrod. Other queen nominees were Nola Hughes, Missy Moore and Diana Murdock. The Homecoming luncheon was held at the school cafeteria and was served by the Band Booster Club.

The Mountaineers dominated the Miles Bulldogs as they worked their Black Magic for a 33-6 win. The Mounties defense proved tough once again as the Bulldogs managed only 73 yards total offense.

The First Baptist Church members and former members met Sunday, October 13 to observe the 105th Anniversary of the Church. Theme for the day was celebrating the Past, Present and Future.

The Mountaineers gained a hard-fought 31-16 win over the Eden Bulldogs for their Homecoming game. All West Texas linebacker Shelby Tuttle lead the Mounties with 15 tackles and nine assists, followed by Craig Duquette's 5 tackles and five assists.

The City of Santa Anna was awarded \$186,000 by the Texas Department of Community Affairs to expand the city's sanitary land fill.

Mrs. C. D. Brue, Santa Anna historian, was honored as Rural Citizen of the Year at the Coleman Chamber of Commerce Banquet held October 19, 1985. Mrs. Bruce

has published seven books on Central Texas history and is working on a book chiefly on Coleman County.

The Mountaineers tied with the Irion County Hornets 14-14. The tie game left both teams with a share of the District 8-A West Zone lead with three more district games left in the season.

Missy Moore was elected as 1985 Halloween Queen, representing the Senior Class. Ruth Garza was Junior High Princess, representing the eighth grade; Brianna Horner was elected as Grade School Princess, representing the first grade.

The long-awaited day finally came. The History of Coleman County and Its People, a Coleman County history book, arrived and was distributed on Tuesday and Wednesday, October 29 and 30.

Boy Scout Troop 230 attended the "Scouting Alive in '85" Fall Camporee held near Lawn, Texas. The scouts brought home a second place ribbon on overall events, which included knot tying, fire building, compass work and an Emergency Preparedness drill.

The Santa Anna Mountaineers brought home yet another victory after playing the Robert Lee Steers. Santa Anna remained tied with Irion County for the lead for District 8-A West Zone title. The Mounties beat the Steers 35-0

NOVEMBER 1985

The Santa Anna Mountaineer Band was awarded a rating of a Division II rating for their marching routine on Saturday, October 26 in Brady. Cathy Baxter led the band in field direction as drum major. Lonnie Baker is band director.

The Mountaineers secured a playoff berth after a 27-6 win over the Bronte Longhorns. The Mounties remained tied with Irion County for the District 8-A West lead. After this game the Mounties are 8-0-1 on the year and ranked 18th by the Harris Poll.

Melissa Buse was elected as 1985 Band Sweetheart and Russell Williams was elected as 1985 Band Beau. Jeanene Jones was elected as 1985 Football Sweetheart and Johnny Herrod as 1985 Football Beau.

The Mountaineers shutout Water Valley, 20-0, leaving the Mounties still tied with Irion County for the District 8-A West lead. The Mountaineers will go up against Goldthwaite for a playoff game.

A Community Thanksgiving Service was held at First Baptist Church with the Methodist, Presbyterian, Seventh Day Adventist, Northside Baptist and First Baptist churches participating. Special music was provided by a community choir, by the children's choir of First United Methodist Church and by several soloists.

The Mountaineers, making their first post-season appearance in five years, bowed out of the playoff picture, after coming up against the Goldthwaite Eagles, (who eventually won the State Championship in December) losing 27-0.

The Adventure Campfire Girls enjoyed an outing on November 23, at the lake on the Earl Simmon place. The girls improved their outdoor living skills and the afternoon included hiking, recognizing animal tracks and signs, identifying and watching birds and studying other elements of

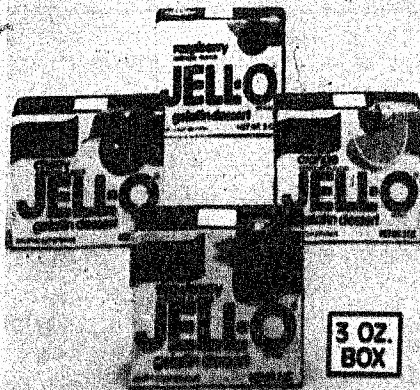

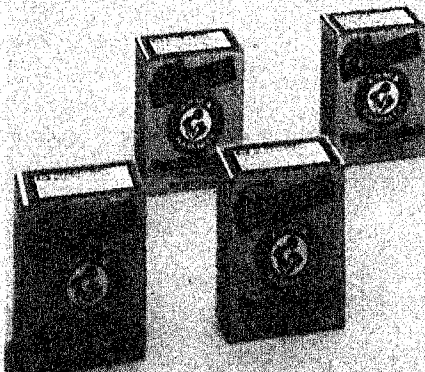

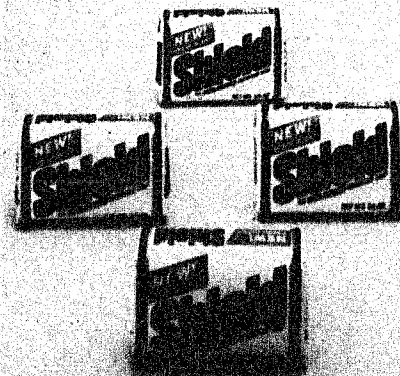

Senior class officers are President—Shelby Tuttle, Vice-President—Michelle Malone, Secretary—Treasurer—Jeanene Jones and Reporter—Alys Pelton.

The Rockwood Homecoming was held at the Community Center, Sunday, September 15, 1985, with some 100 former residents and friends registering.

The Mountaineers shutout Water Valley, 20-0, leaving the Mounties still tied with Irion County for the District 8-A West lead. The Mountaineers will go up against Goldthwaite for a playoff game.
