tain degree, assuming your problain degree, assuming your probdred to one they won't be, but this writing may alert you in a general,
overall way overall way.
Since I am
Since $I$ am nearly finished waiting for our house but am by no
means a professional builder, a mere peon in the scheme of painters, roofers, brickers,' glaziers, technical nor professional, I simply want to share the view of buildee rather than the builder! you will need a plan, a plot, and hing at all you need to sit down with your mate and discover the asets that you can set aside for this worth to you?? How much can you afford to spend? This is crucial because without a definite figure neiwhere to draw the linc. And for hose who need to depend on outside sources such as a lending facilty, they may indeed require a conrete limit. As for us, we had been quirreled away some funds, but we ailed to have an amount on paper and we didn't estimate the value of very stick going into its construcion. We soon became paralyzed with apprehension, not a condition at any time, but even less in the traumatic time of housebuilding.
However, you'll also need to visit hardware and estimate prices of desired materials o the nearest penny; plus remember to include all the labor costs. Then you must total all these figres. Weeks later, when you've gantuan amount, multiply by three. cost of your dream home. No longer a dream?? More of a nightmare, you say?? Why, we aven't even started yet!!!?

need to spend more time with our children and what better way than to lake them fishing and hopefully strengthen the bond between parent and child.
hildren fishing, their attention pan is short, they get their lines langled with everything, but they Tove fishing with Mom or Dad.
The only thing they love better he only thing they love better fishing with both parents. We must remember that children often cannot fish like we do. They are rrankbaits or spinnerbaits all day They do not have the patience to watch a rod tip for hours waiting for the subtle twitch of a catfish bite. They do like 10 catch fish, to
be outdoors, and to spend time with

Some suggestions for fish trips. with kids: ryy sunfish (known lo cally as "perch"); they are plentiful,
willing to bite a hook, are stron fighters for their size, and quite tasty when fried. Another species
often over looked by fishing fami often over looked by fishing fami-
lies is white bass, which are also plentiful, strong fighters, and normally easy to catch.. These species are good for children to start out on because the action is usually steady it not fast. Good lakes in our area
to fish for larger than average sunfish are Lakes Sweetwater, Hords Creek, Sealy, Santana and Barird. One of the best ways to tig a kids: or number suish is with a number six or number eight long shank. cricket loat. a spait with a $1-1 / 2$. to 2 -inch ection of nightcrawler. Adults too can have a blast with these small
fish if the tackle is matched to the fish if the tackle is matched to the ish. A haff pound sunfish puts up

Special meetings of the memberis may be held at any place within the County of Coleman in the State of Texas specified in the notice of the special meeting, or elsewhere within the area served by the

SECTION 3. NOTICE OF MEMBERS' MEETING. Writen or printed notice stating the place, day and hour of the meeting and, in case of a special meeting, the purpose or. purposes for which the meeting is callech shall be delivered not less than ten (10) days nor more than twenty (20) days before the daife of the meeting, either personally or by mail, by or at the direction of the Secretary, or by the persons calling the meeting, to each member; provided; however, that with respect to alt meetings at which directors are to be elected such notice shall be so delivered not less than ten (10) days nor more than fourtien (14) days before the date of than ten (10) days nor more than fourteen (14) days before the date of the meeting.
