## TAAS and TEAMS Tests To Be Taken July 11-13

The TAAS and TEAMS tests will be offered this July at Gorman High School. By state law, students who are now enrolled in high school must pass all sections of the test in order to receive a high school diploma.
Anyone the TEAMS or TAAS may who has completed all graduation requirements except for passing the TEAMS or TAAS may take these tests to try to earn a high school diploma. A person who are no longer enrolled in a Texas public school and who wish to retake a portion of the TAAS or the TEAMS may pick up a registration packet at any high school campus. In Gorman registration packets will be available in the High School Office. Forms must be completed and are to be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than June 9, 2000.
Students who are currently enrolled in Gorman High School do not need to register for this
test. Persons who have not finished high school and who are interested in obtaining their diplomas, must fulfill the requirements for graduation that were in effect when their class graduated. Therefore, if the TAAS was not required for a person's class, it would not be required today.
