The Big Red have only 21 on the squad this year and at present two of these are injured. It is hoped that one starter, Joe Rodgers, who is out with an injury, will be back by the second game. The other injured player is Steven Scitern.

The Panthers are coming off a 5-5 season last year and really have some tough opponents lined up this season. In the district race Baird, Santa Anna, Rising Star and Evant are expected to have the inside track according to most prognosticators, however, we look for the Big Red to really battle these folks for the title spot.


center; Brian Lasater, 160 pound tackle; and John Carter, 160 pound end.


