





Austin Charles Rice



Jury Convicts Man of Aggravated Sexual Assault

Stephen Paul Patel, formerly of Gorman, was convicted of Aggravated Sexual Assault this past week by an Eastland County Jury in the 91st District Court. In June of last year, Patel and another inmate at the Eastland County Jail, sexually assaulted a third male inmate who was serving time on a charge of child pornography. After hearing testimony from several witnesses, the jury returned a quick verdict of guilty and sentenced Patel to eight years confinement in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Patel who was 20 years old, will serve at least 4 years before being eligible for parole. Prosecutors Bill Dowell and Russ Thomason were grateful to the jury and pleased that the jury agreed that even inmates imprisoned in the county jail can be victims.

Patel was not eligible for a probated sentence in that he was previously convicted earlier this year by another Eastland County Jury for Aggravated Assault of a Public Servant, a Gorman Police Officer.
