Panthers Season Ends Win Loss

The Gorman Panthers lost the final game of the season on February 6th to the Rising Star Wildcats by an 87 - 62 margin. The Wildcats jumped out to a 27 - 14 first quarter lead then the teams played on even terms until halftime. With the Wildcats lead 43 to 30. In the third quarter the Wildcats outscored the Panthers 22-14, then added 23 more in the fourth period for the 87-62 victory.

Nick Guthery led the Panthers with 14 points and 8 rebounds. Donald Majors hit 13 points with 2 rebounds. Justin Snider had 9 points and 4 rebounds and Jason Posey also had 9 points with 3 rebounds. Nic Burleson scored 7 points with 7 rebounds. Justin Burleson hit 6 points and Margarito Sanchez had 4 points with 5 rebounds.

The Panthers hit 23 of 60 from the floor for 38%. They shot 13 of 30 free throws for 43% with 34 rebounds and 13 turnovers.

Rising Star hit 32 of 58 from the floor for 55%. They shot 14 of 23 free throws for 61% and had 29 rebounds and 8 turnovers.

Gorman had a season record of 8-17 and were 2-6 in District.
