



Silage Tour Planned In Comanche July 2

The Comanche County Extension Dairy Committee has planned a Silage Tour for Wednesday, July 2. Registration is scheduled for 9:00 to 9:30 a.m. in the courthouse parking lot where the tour group will leave from. The Silage Tour will include two continuing education credits fro Commercial, Noncommercial and Private applicators and a sponsored noon lunch. To preregister contact the Texas Agricultural Extension Office in Comanche County a (915) 356-2539.

The Silage Tour will include several stops to discuss silage varieties, fertility, herbicide programs, chopping including particle sizes for good ration quality, inoculants, packing and silo size. Plans are to visit a demonstration in corn silage varieties where producers can see hybrids before chopping and discuss variety characteristics, fertility programs to increase quality and yield and herbicides. A second stop will feature a field at harvest for discussion of particle length and silage maturity at harvest. A third stop will include a look at silage preservation from bagging products to pack-

Tour speakers will include Dr. Eric Protsko, a new Extension Agronomist. Eric will start his new position as Agronomist at the Stephenville Research and Extension Center on July 1.
