



## 348 Animals Entered In County Livestock Show

One of the largest Eastland County Livestock Shows in recent years will begin Thursday, March 13. County 4-H and FFA youth have entered 348 animals in this year's show. An additional 15 to 20 rabbits will be entered Friday. The stock show will be held at the county show barns on Highway 3101, north of Eastland.

Approximately \$3000 will be given as premiums to the exhibitors. The exhibits will be brought to the show Thursday afternoon except rabbits, which must be in place by noon Friday. All other animals must be in place by 10:00 p.m. Thurs-

Judging of the classes will

begin at 11:00 a.m. Friday with the Dairy animals. On Friday afternoon, all swine, goats and breeding sheep will be judged followed by judging of rabbits and lambs Friday night. All beef cattle will be judged Saturday morning.

An auction sale of market animals will end the stock show Saturday night, at the Eastland Auction Company. The 1980 Livestock Show Catalogue is dedicated to the memory of Ed Harrison. Ed was owner of the BB Hereford Ranch near Gorman. He was president of the Eastland County Livestock Raisers in 1959 and was beef superintendent of the sow for ten years.

J.S. Ripley, President of the Livestock Raiser's Association, said 28 trophies will be given to exhibitors who show outstanding skills in showing their animals. This is the most trophies ever given in the show.

Bill Claborn, Superintendent of the show, gives the following number of animals entered in each division: 8 dairy heifers; 23 goats; 38 breeding swine; 132 market hogs; 27 breeding sheep; 64 lambs; 17 steers; and 39 breeding beef animals.

Everyone is invited to attend the show and support the exhibitors.



A PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM JUDGE JIM R. WRIGHT:

Upon my assuming the position of District Judge of the 91st District, I immediately embarked upon a course of action which would result in the increase of the number of cases disposed of.

Cases do not dispose of themselves, but rather are disposed of by hard work, by setting the cases for trial and by actually trying them. A program such as this requires work and time. Such a program requires work not only by myself and the staff of the 91st District

Court, but also by the general public as jurors. On many occasions jurors are called to Court but do not actually serve in the trying of a case. Nevertheless, the jurors who are called fulfill an important role in the administration of justice. Many cases are settled and disposed of civil as well as criminal, without trial just because the case has been called for trial and a jury is present waiting to try the case. Therefore, your work and mine is not in vain because our goal of disposition and justice has been reached.

In the short time in which I have been privileged to serve as your Judge, we have utilized an average of over two jury weeks per month in the administration of justice. The remainder of the time has been used extensively and solely for non-jury matters. We intend to continue our work in this area in an effort to give all parties their day in court. You have a right to expect this from your Court, and will receive no less so long as I am serving you as your Judge.

Many politicians make many promises which they cannot keep. However, one promise that I can and will make and keep is that. if I am elected to continue as Judge of the 91st District Court, the Court will be a working Court and will be one in which cases are tried and disposed of as rapidly as possible in accordance with justice. I am asking you to assist me in my keeping of this promise. Your vote and your support will enable us to continue with the plans and to reach the goals which we

all have for the 91st District Court. Thank you.
