The bids on the police car were opened and read. Robert Ervin made the motion, seconded by Johnny Smith, to accept the cheapest bid of \$13,164 given by Bayer Motor Co. Motion carried 3-0.

Robert Ervin made the motion, seconded by Johnny Smith to purchase each city employee a ham for Christmas. Motion carried 3-0.

A new fine schedule was presented to the Commission by Chief Simpson. Johnny Smith made the motion, seconded by Robert Ervin to accept the new fine schedule. Motion carried 3-0.

Bids were opened for surplus amd old office supplies. One bid was received for the base antenna and radio; one bid was received for the 200 GT Citizens printer. Robert Ervin made the motion, seconded by Johnny Smith, to accept each bid. Motion carried 3-0.

Johnny Smith made the motion, seconded by Robert Ervin, to prohibit smoking in the city front office and to designate smoking areas in the kitchen and commission room. Motion carried 3-0.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 6:45 p. m.
