TAAS and TEAMS Test To Be Taken July $16-18$
The TAAS and TEAMS tests will be offered this July at Gorman High School. By state law, students who are now enrolled in high school must pass all sections of the test in order to receive a high school diploma. Anyone in the community who has completed all graduation requireearn a high school diploma. A person only has to take that portion of the test earn a high school diploma. Aperson only has to take that portion of the test
that he or she did not pass in high school. Individuals who are no longer enrolled in a Texas public school and who wish to retake a portion of the TAAS and TEAMS may pick up a registration packet at any high school campus. In Gorman registration packets will be available in the counselor's office until May 24. After that date, packets will be available in the Superintendent's office. Forms must be completed and are to be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than June 14, 1996.
