# IRIAM FERGUSON'S LEAD IS INCREAS

Dr. H. B. Tanner Suggests Practical Plan, Both for Service and Economy

Dr. H. B. Tanner of Eastland comes forward not only with a clear and definite plan for more efficient and, at the same time, more economical county government, but he accompanies it with a suggestion as to how it may be given an impetus during the next few months to make it a practi-

cal possibility.
It is seldom, if ever denied, that political managers of city, county and state do not measure up to corporation managers in point of effi-ciency, and the county government is recognized as one of the most la-mentably inefficient of all. Dr. Tanner suggests a county manager who shall have charge of all the county's affairs, including the assessment and collection of taxes, building and main tenance of roads and other matters pertaining to the welfare and prog-ress of the county. He suggests that the legislature, when it meets next year, give immediate attention to some plan—possibly the manager plan—looking to more efficient county government. Dr. Tanner's letter contains much that is worth careful thought. He says:

New Kind of County Government

I believe that a majority of students of economics agree that the present system of county government is weak, inefficient, wasteful, confused and extremely extravagent. Everybody wants the county to be well governed. It fails because it is organized in a way that makes bad government almost certain.

Some wise-sounding people are always saying that the form of any government is of little consequence, that all government is good if hon-estly administered; that all have their source in the voters that an have their source in the voters that, as a fountain cannot rise higher than its source, government is bad only because of low morality and intelligence in the voters.

This sounds wise, but it is non-sense. In business nobody pays any attention to such drivel.

Corporations are managed by stockholders of average intelligence and morality; but they succeed. Why? Because the corporation form of government is built to succeed.

Law Works Clumsily.
The voters are the stockholders in ne county government and at present the law fastens upon them the impossible task of finding good managers, bookkeepers and workmen through the clumsy, crude and cumbersome devices of a primary and a general election. The law in this particular is at fault, is not proper and ought to be improved through

Let us look for a moment at the duties of the county officers. Most of the officials are simply bookkeepers, in fact practically all of the county officials work on books except the sheriff and district attorney. ney. Take the case of the recorder of deeds and the clerk of the court, they are simply bookkeepers along

If all of these county officials did not have to go out and try for re-election every two years, with all of its attendant expense and loss of time, competent men could be had for bookkeepers wages to fill all of these positions. The fact is any competent bookkeeper could do the work better than the elected men can usually perform the same. For if the voters ever do elect proper

men for these offices it is from pure accident. 
