Emma Goldman was permitted to enjoy the protection of the constitution of the United States too long; she should have been sent to her "beloved Russia" years ago, before the principles which she upheld became widespread and secured such a foothold in the minds of the unwary.

And the fight is to go on. The Times does not fear that Emma Goldman will ever be permitted to enter the United States again-not if we know it, she won't. But her teachings are left, that is the only source for alarm, if, indeed, there is any.






