HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY TO BE PROTECTED

Public Opinion Demands That Health Be Protected, Child Specialist Declares.

 SAN FRANCISCO, June 29.—The demand for individual and community health protection is overwhelming, Dr. Walter M. Dickie of Sacramento, told the child specialists and experts on protective medicine at their sessions with the American Medical association here today. "Its development has followed a natural course, receiving its inception in the war draft and in the health protection afforded our men while under arms," he said. "Public opinion is strongly entrenched behind the movement and scientific medicine must take the leadership in fulfilling the demand."

Use Preventive Medicine.
 Dr. Henry Boswell, of Sanatorium, Miss., told how the medical profession could co-operate with non-medical agencies in the prevention and control of tuberculosis.

In continuing the discussion Dr. John M. Dodson, secretary of the council on Health and Public Instruction of the American Medical association, said that the successful plan must seek the best interests of the public. He pointed out that public health work is without the co-operation of the general practitioner and urged family physicians to give more attention to preventive medicine.

Mother Needs Proper Care.
 The child specialists and experts considered methods of lowering the mortality of infants in this country. Special emphasis was laid by Arthur B. Spaulding, of San Francisco, on the relation of venereal disease and other infections of the mother to deaths in infancy. It was pointed out that proper care of the mother before the child is born will prevent many of these deaths.

Dr. John A. Foote, of Washington, D. C., stated his belief that statistics give only an approximate idea of the influence which birth injuries and

hemorrhagic diseases have on infant death, and urged more careful examination of the bodies of infants dying from such causes in order to determine methods of prevention. Only with a knowledge of the cause can prevention be scientifically applied, he said.

BRAN INDORSED BY PHYSICIANS AS VERY GOOD FOOD FOR MAN

Chemical analysis of bran has shown it to contain about 8 per cent of mineral salts, and also small percentages of phosphorus and calcium. Of these, mineral salts is a particularly valuable ingredient, and physicians state that there is no danger of there being too great a supply of the latter elements in the diet.

Medical consideration of the prescription of bran has followed not only the substitution for cathartics, but has reasoned also that the human system is a finely wrought mechanism which functions with greater efficiency when not requiring laxatives and that a regular diet, including bran, fruits and other cellulose containing foods does away with the necessity of artificial stimulation for catharsis.

BRAN PUDDING
 (Chef Francois Schmitt, Hotel Pennsylvania, New York City.)

Four heaping teaspoonfuls Kellogg's bran, 1 tablespoonful flour, 1-2 tablespoonful corn starch, 4 eggs, 3 tablespoonfuls sugar, 1-2 cup butter, 1-2 pint milk.

Chop up butter with flour, corn starch, bran and half of the sugar and add to boiling milk; stir well on fire for about one minute, take off, mix in the four yolks. At last add the four whites beaten stiff with rest of sugar. Pour in well buttered and sugared form and set in pan with a little water in bottom and bake in medium oven for about 30 minutes. Serve with apricot sauce made as follows:

Put contents of one small can of apricots through a sieve, and one-half pound of sugar and let boil for about five minutes.

SLAVE STATION, USED IN CIVIL WAR DAYS, DESTROYED BY FIRE

 PETERSBURG, Ind., June 29.—Another station of one of the most

famous institutions that ever reached into Indiana—the underground railroad for running slaves into the northern states—has passed. Fire recently destroyed the landmark.


The house, located in this vicinity, caught fire because of a defective flue. It originally was owned by John Posey, father of Frank B. Posey, former representative in congress, and

was the home of the Posey family in the days preceding the Civil war. Many escaped slaves were hidden in its secret cellar and tunnel and assisted in getting to Canada, according to old-time residents.

The residence stood on a high bluff along White river, commanding a view of the surrounding country for many miles. It contained secret closets, secret cellars and in the war period a secret tunnel led to the river.


