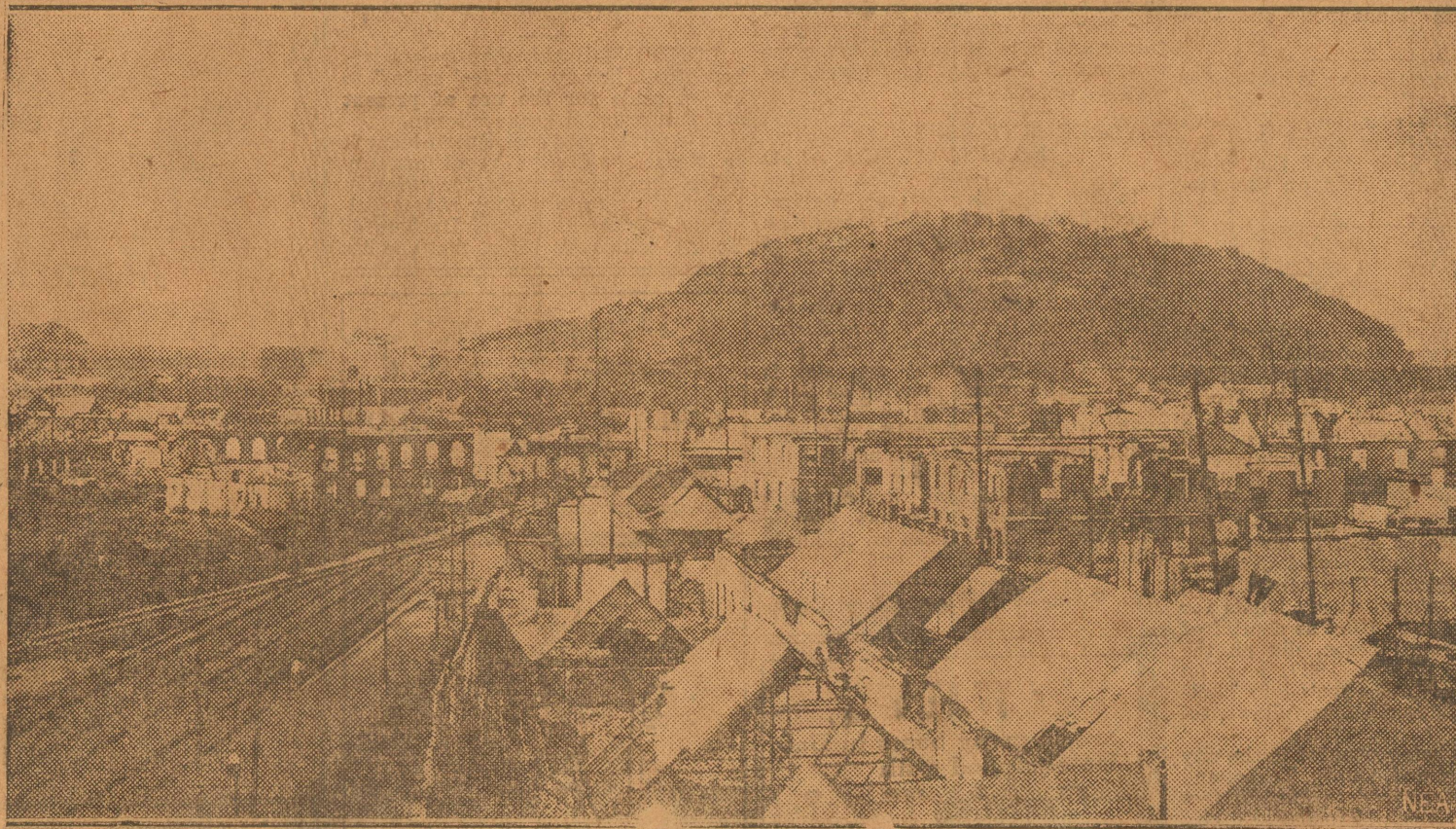
FOREIGNERS IN SHANGHAI SAFE SAYS NATIONALIST COMMANDER

Four Candidates File for School Trustee Places

Three men have filed conditionally and one man conditionless, for the four vacancies to be filled on Saturday, on the Ranger Independent school board.

Garvin Chastain, is the only one who has no strings attached to his application. He will serve, if the people want him. Chastain lives near Hodges Oak Park school, has two children, one in school, and is willing to give his time to the school board in the interests of Ranger schools.

M. H. Hagaman, a veteran of some sixteen terms as a school trustee, has signed up, but he pleads that if any one will take his place, they may do so, as he has plenty to do and has served a long time.

J. T. Killingsworth, who is a member of the present board, has signed up practically the same way, saying that he does not want it, if any one else will take it.

Like Ervin, also a member of the present board, has signed up, but condition is that if any one else will take the position he does not want his name on, for the reason that his business will take him out of the city part of the time.

There are four places to fill. The ballots will be printed on Thursday, and the names will have to be filed with the school secretary at the city hall, by Wednesday night.

It is reported that one or two others may file before Wednesday night, possibly a woman or two, and if a woman's name does not appear on the ballot this election, it will be the first time in several years, as several Ranger women have held the responsible position of school trustee.

Attention Called To Various Duties Of Commissioners

With the city election in Ranger, just around the corner, attention is called to the duties of the officers who are commonly called the "city dads". Section two, of the Ranger city charter defines the duties of the mayor as follows:
The mayor shall have and exercise all powers, functions, and duties prescribed by law and vested in him by the provisions of the charter of the city of Ranger. He shall be ex-officio a member of all committees appointed or formed under any resolution or ordinance adopted or passed by the board of commissioners, unless financially or personally interested in the subject matter placed in care of such committees. He shall appoint all standing committees, and assign the various members of the governing body of the city to consider the condition, needs, duties, and conduct of the various departments of the city government, as hereinafter provided. The various members of the city council, or governing body, shall be assigned to the various departments and designated as follows:
(a) Fire and police commissioner
(b) Bridge and street commissioner
(c) Finance commissioner
(d) commissioner of sanitation.

T. & P. Road to Install Safety System at Ranger

A wig-wag system is to be installed at the Prairie crossing on the Texas & Pacific railroad, on Blackwell road, Ranger, in the very near future. This information has been received from railway officials by C. C. Patterson, secretary of the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, and comes as a result of efforts put forth by the commercial organization and others, which extend over a period of many months.
The making safe of the Blackwell road crossing, commonly known as the Prairie crossing on account of its proximity to the Prairie camp, comes as good news to every citizen in Ranger, more especially to those who live in Cooper addition, access to which is via the crossing or up Hunt street. This crossing has been the scene of several fatal accidents, and daily school children are passing across it to St. Rita's or Cooper school.
On account of the Prairie camp and Chestnut-Smith offices, and the two schools being on that side of the track and also being the gateway to the Gholson pool, a great deal of traffic crosses this dangerous crossing each day. A system that will protect human life and property will mean immeasurable benefit to Ranger.


