Goodbye, MTV; hello, Fox

Gordon Smith, manager of TCA Cable TV which ser-
vices Texico - Farwell, said he company won't offer MTV after June 30 due to objec-
tions over the channel's content.
"We have received complaints from customers about the channel, increasing over the last year," he said. "During recent contract renewal talks with MTV, we expressed concern over these com-
plaints to them and asked that we be allowed to of fer their service only to customers who wished to view it. However, MTV refused to al-
low us to offer the channel on a customer by customer basis."
Also at issue, said Smith, A. MIVs refusal to include assurances about the chan-
nel's product quality in its on the scene in 1981 , the
