Grain sorghum harvest starting

Harvest is well underway. Cabbage and pumpkins are out of the fields, corn harvest is winding down and grain sorghum corn yielding as high as 16,000 plus pounds and dryland sorghum as high as 4000 pounds. Wheat around the county looks good, but is not growing. A good rain would improve wheat conditions.

Stop watering trees in the fall so that they are encouraged to go into dormancy. Also don't put any fertilizer in the root zone of the tree after July so it is not rapidly growing in the fall.
