

President Lincoln signed legislation in 1862 establishing national cemeteries.

Memorial observances for honoring the war dead began in the mid-1860's in Columbus, Ga.; Columbus, Miss.; Waterloo, N.Y., and Carbondale, III.

Apparently inspired by President Lincoln's attendance as speaker at Carbondale, Gen. (ret.) John Logan as Commander - in - Chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, the private organization representing Union veterans, issued a general order on May 5, 1868 establishing a nationwide Decoration Day on May 30.

Among the benefits service to their country earned them is the honor of burial in one of the 114 national cemeteries administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Nationwide, more than two million Americans rest in national cemeteries, soldiers lots, Confederate cemeteries and monuments. Overseas, in 24 American Battle Monuments' cemeteries, 125,000 Americans are buried.

In Texas, VA national cemeteries at El Paso, Houston, Kerrville, and San Antonio conducted 5,558 burials last year.

Women veterans, spouses and certain dependents are buried in national cemeteries. The first woman service member buried was Florena Budwin of Michigan who, disquised as a man, had followed her soldier husband to war. He fell in battle and as a Confederate prisoner she nursed sick prisoners until her death. While Budwin was buried in special circumstances, Congress in 1948 made official the precedents and traditions in eligibility of spouses and dependent children for national cemetery burial.



The Farwell School Board iuesday got the ball rolling on its building project.

It agreed to sign a contract with Monterey Construction Co., Wolfforth, Texas, for \$2.39 million. Work may start next week.

Planned are new classrooms at all three school campuses plus a new gym. The project will cost about \$55 a square foot.

The board had held a special meeting May 20, at which time it tentatively approved hiring Monterey after various changes were made to lower the construction cost.

Supt. Richard Boothby said the main changes were:

1. Eliminate a new parking lot, at savings of \$54,000. This can be built later.

2. Use PVC pipe for plumbing, rather than copper tubing called for in the original specifications.

# **Farwell Feed Yards shares honor**

Farwell Feed Yards and its parent company, AzTx Cattle Co., have lowered work- related injury costs by 30 percent from 1991 to 1992 through carefully managing care provided to each injured employee and by implementing a safety incentive program.

For its dramatic health care cost reductions, AzTx Cattle Co. is winner of the first annual Merck/National Managed Health Care Congress Partnership Award, given recently in Washington, D.C.

AzTx safety director Tull Bailey said the company's efforts at reducting worker injury costs began in earnest in May 1991 when there Hereford-based company became a nonsubscriber to the workers' compensation system in Texas, where about 85 of the feeder's 145 employees are located. The Texas workers' compensation system has become too costly for many of the state's businesses to continue to participate so many firms, like AzTx, opted to become non- subscribers. So AzTx contracted with OccuSystem's AIM (active injury/illness management) program. In the 12 months prior to starting the OccuSystems' plan, AzTx paid \$75,812 for workers compensation, compared to \$53,154 for the 12 months after the plan's inception. Total claims for the year before the plan were 85 compared to 75 for the following year. Cost per injured employee was reduced to \$415 from \$592.

Bailey said AzTx was able to put together a plan that meets government rules and is the same or better than the Texas plan. Here's how it works: in the first 10 days following an injury, the firm pays 100 percent of wages and all medical costs. After the first 10 days, if the employee is not back to work, the firm asks him to sign a release, then the firm will pay 100 percent of wages for the next 20 days and all medical costs for the first full year after the injury. After the first year, the firm's disability policy will pay 67 percent of wages for 402 weeks.




Bailey said the company hasn't had an employee out for more than 30 days since the program started in 1991. He credits OccuSystems with helping employees get back to work faster.

Another part of the AzTx program is a safety incentive plan. The company came up with a ballpark figure for what injuries cost the company per employee each quarter. That figure is multiplied by the number of workers (excluding managers and clerical employees) at each feed yard to get the amount allocated to the safety incentive program for the quarter.

If there are no injury costs during the quarter, the entire amount is split between the participating employees based on how many days they worked that quarter. During quarters in which injury costs are incurred, the costs are deducted from the total amount and the remainder is allocated to employees.

Bailey said this gives Farwell Feed Yards' employees a strong financial incentive for keeping safety in mind while they work.

# In honor of Parmer County servicemen usho perished in service to their country



James R. Fortenberry

James Richard Fortenberry, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Fortenberry, was born in Amarillo. His parents moved to Friona where he was raised. He graduated from the Oklahoma Military Academy in 1968 and joined the U.S. Army in September 1969.

He was assigned to the 15th Medical Battalion of the 1st Cavalry in Vietnam. He was "crew chief" on a "MEDEVAC" helicopter when he died Sept. 24, 1970.

He was awarded the Distinguished Flying cross, the Air Medal with 7 through 8 Award, the Army Commendation Medal, Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Aircraft Crewman Badge (Wings), and Republic of Vietnam Armed Forced Honor Medal.

The "MEDEVAC" motto is "so that others may live," will also be remembered in Spec. 4 Fortenberry.


#### Harold R. Crook

Harold R. Crook, son of French and Nellie Crook of Bovina, attended Bovina Schools. He was killed in action on June 15, 1952, during the Korean War. He was 24 years old.

He was drafted into the U.S. Army and entered with a group of young men from the Alpine, Texas, area. He wrote home expressing anxiety about the huge man sleeping in the bunk over him. It was later found that this man was Dan Blocker who later was a star of the TV show "Bonanza."

Crook was assigned to Company I of the 45th Infantry Division. His company was shipped out to Hokkaido, Japan, and eventually on to Korea.

He had attained the rank of Sergeant First Class and was killed when his bunker sustained a direct hit. His location was overtaken by the North Koreans and it was some time before they were forced out and the casualties were discovered.



**Rex McElroy** 

In March 1942, Parmer County's casualty list was started when Mr. and Mrs. F. W. McElroy, formerly of Farwell, received word that their son, Rex, was believed lost along with other members of the crew on the submarine "Shark".

The War Department's communique revealed that the Shark was more than 30 days overdue, and was presumed lost in the Far East.

E M 2-C McElroy was a Navy man of some years. having served one 4-year hitch on the "Texas" and "Nevada", and then entering the submarine branch, where he had three years of training at a sub base before war was declared.

He would have been 28 years of age in July 1942.



#### H. Macyl Roberts

Entering service on March 15, 1942, Herman Macyl Roberts served overseas from July that same year to Feb. 19, 1944, when he was reported killed in action in the battle for Eniwetok Island, which came to a successful end three days later.



Loyd Reiser

An unexpected tragedy of war took the life of Sgt. Loyd Reiser, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward J. Reiser, on May 14, 1944.

Flying in formation with other C-47 transport planes, over Italy, Reiser was killed when his plane collided with two others in the formation. Thirteen young Americans went to their deaths in the crash.

Reiser was engaged in farming north of Bovina for some time, and had attended the Bovina, Rhea and Friona schools. He volunteered for the Air Force on Dec. 28, 1941.

Burial was in the Mt. Sopranio Military Cemetery, not far from Rome, Italy.



William J. Palmer

Pvt. Williams J. Palmer lost his life in an accident. the nature of which is not known, on April 25, 1944, after he had been in the European Theater of

Crook's name also appears on a memorial erected in the city of El Paso, Texas. and dedicated to the soldiers killed in the Korean War from the El Paso area.

He was buried in April 1954 in Bovina Cemetery, next to his brother, Richard, who was killed in 1948 in a truck accident between Portales and Roswell, N.M.



#### Ples L. New

Mr. and Mrs. E. R. New, formerly of Friona, were informed in July 1944 that their son, Ples LeGrande New, met his death in France on July 8. New was connected with the local Farmer's Elevator before entering service.

In March 1942, he entered service and was assigned to Camp Barkeley, Texas for training with the 90th Division, 358th Infantry, following which he went to California in 1943 for desert training.

Just two years after his entry into the Army, he sailed with the 90th for England, and was there one month before joining in the invasion of France on June 6. A short six weeks later, Sgt. New met his death by enemy action. He was 37.

According to information received by Mrs. H.W. Roberts of Lascar, Colo., PFC Roberts was buried at Japtan, in the South Pacific.

His first overseas assignment was to Wallace Island in the Samoa group, where he was stationed for 16 months. From there, Roberts went to the Hawaiian Islands, serving from October 1943, to January 1944. His last letter came from Hawaii. His movements are

then unknown until Feb. 17, 1944, when he took part in the Battle for Engibi Island.



#### Nathaniel E. Taylor

Drowning claimed the life of young Pvt. Nathaniel E. Taylor, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. E. Taylor of Friona, when he was swimming in the San Marcos River near San Marcos, Texas. The accident occurred on April 28, 1944.

Taylor entered the Army at Fort Sill on May 28, 1943, and shortly thereafter was sent to Sheppard Field, and later to Kelley Field. On Nov. 1, he was moved to San

Marcos, where he entered the Air Corps navigation school.

Operations for one year. He went overseas on April 24, 1943.

At the age of 20, he enlisted on May 19, 1942, and received his training at Camp Barkley, Texas, where he was assigned to the 745th Tank Battalion. His burial plot is unknown.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. W.D. Palmer, Route 1, Friona, Texas.



#### J.R. Caldwell, Jr.

A Christmas holiday which ended in a plane crash in the mountains of New Mexico on Dec. 26, 1942, was responsible for the death of 2nd Lt. J. R. (June) Caldwell, Jr., after he and his cousin, Staff Sgt. Maxwell M. Caldwell of San Antonio, had spent Christmas in the home of the J. R.'s parents near Farwell.

Apparently out of control, the plane crashed in the Mogollon range shortly after clearing Roswell, enroute to Williams Field, Ariz., where the young men were stationed. Heavy snows covered all traces of the crash and the bodies until the following fall.

#### **Oran Brown**

A resident of Lariat, he died in the Philippine Islands during World War II.

# In honor of Parmer County servicemen who perished in service to their country



Claude I. Gober

Lt. Claude Isom Gober, son of Mr. and Mrs. J.I. Gober of Farwell, was born on Aug. 3, 1920, near Frederick, Okla., and died in the crash of a B-17 plane near Wargrave, England on Nov. 13, 1943.

Affectionately known as "Buzz", the young man grew up in the Oklahoma Lane community, joining the AAF in August, 1944. He trained as a bombardier on a B-17 at Ellington Field, Houston, and Big Spring, receiving his commission in April, 1943, leaving the States in September of that year.

His death was one of unaccountables of war. According to a letter from Sampson Sharff, who ordinarily served as co-pilot in the crew with Gober, the B-17 started out on an operational mission, and while over Britain went into a spin that carried most of the crew to death.

Gober, as bombardier, could have released the plane's bombs and possibly saved some lives, but the bombs would have struck a small English town, and the ship went down with its load of explosives.





Everett L. Gee

PFC Everett Louis Gee, of the U.S. Marines, gave his life in action against the Japanese on the island of Peliliu, in the Palau group, on Sept. 28, 1944. He was 20 years of age at the time of his death.

Gee, son of Mrs. F.R. Barber of Bovina, and husband of Julia Hardage Gee, entered the service at San Diego, and was sent to overseas duty on April 18, 1944.



#### Virgil H. Weis

PFC Virgil Harry Weis, son of Mrs. Carl Bender of Friona, is buried in an American military cemetery on Tacoblan, in the Philippines.

He died in an American hospital near Palo on Leyte in the Philippines, on April 2, 1945. The cause of his death was not determined.

Weis spent more than four years in the service, having been inducted on March 2, 1941.



S. Dence Justice

Sgt. Stephen Dence Justice, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam J. Justice of Farwell, was killed in action in the Battle of the Bulge, on Dec. 23, 1944. Justice entered service on Jan. 7, 1941, volunteering at Clovis.

At Fort Bliss, he asked to be transferred to the paratroops, and was sent to Fort Benning, Ga., for his training. His first overseas assignment was in Africa, in February 1943, after which he was in the Fifth Army groups which hit the Anzio Beach in the invasion of Italy, and moved into Southern France in September 1944.

Justice belonged to the 509th Parachute Infantry Battalion which was cited for outstanding service by Lt. Gen. Mark W. Clark.

Mrs. Justice received word that her son was buried in an American military cemetery at Henri-Chappelle, in Belgium.

#### John Tetum Wilkerson

Cpl. John T. Wilkerson was born in 1918 in Alvarado, Texas. His family moved to Bovina in 1934 and he was raised in Parmer County, but graduated at Tell, Texas. He moved back to Parmer County before entering the U.S. Army.

He was a Japanese prisoner of war when the Japanese ship he was being transported on was sunk in the Pacific in June 1943.

#### Wesley H. Coker

Wesley H. Coker was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Coker. He was raised in the eastern part of Parmer County, attending schools in Summerfield and Hereford.



Kenneth Wade Bainum, was born March 25, 1930. He died in an Air Force plane crash on Aug. 18, 1964, during the Vietnam War.

He was the son of Charles and Tina Bainum. He is buried in Friona Cemetery.



Ira B. Benger

Capt. Ira B. Benger, of Friona, was killed in an accident which occurred at Biggs Field, El Paso.


He graduated from Friona High in 1937 and attended Texas Tech until he joined the Air Force in 1940.

He was stationed at Santa Maria, Calif., for primary training, and at Moffett Field, Calif. for basic. He graduated from the Stockton, Calif. base in May, 1941, with honors, receiving his second lieutenant commission. He returned to Moffet Field as instructor and later transferred, with the school, to La Moore Field as flight commander.

He volunteered into the B-17 school at Siebling, Fla., qualifying as pilot for all types of planes and upon completion of his work there was stationed at Tucson, as instructor with the B-17. From Tucson, he went to Pueblo, Colo., to instruct in the new school for B-24 pilots, and became a first pilot.

#### William J. Skulley

No information is available about PFC William J. Skulley except for the fact that he was killed in action during World War II.



#### Roy E. Hughes

Staff Sgt. Roy E. Hughes met his death Feb. 12, 1944, while flying his 15th mission as a top turret gunner, with the 15th Air Force.

The plane was shot down near the German-Austrian border and only one crew member, the waist gunner, escaped with his life, only to be taken prisoner.

Hughes was awarded the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf clusters and the Purple Heart, presented posthumously to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. B.A. Hughes, of Friona.

A 1939 graduate of the Friona school, he was employed at Reeves Chevrolet when he entered service on Aug. 7, 1942.

Training was taken at St. Petersburg, Fla., Madison, Wis., Jacksonville, Fla., Harlingen, Texas, and Langley Field, Va. Hughes was assigned to the anti- submarine patrol with a bomber crew, based at Jacksonville, Fla., and later at Cuba before going to Italy with a B-24 crew in September, 1943. He was born in Oklahoma and attended Summerfield school for the lower grades. He attended Hereford schools for the upper grades.

He lived in Parmer County when he joined the U.S. Army. He was a member of the 36th Infantry Division when he died near Salerno, Italy, in 1944. His mother and one sister still live in Friona.

#### Morris E. "Red" Martin

1st Lt. Morris E. "Red" Martin was killed in a plane accident while on a photographic mission when stationed on Honshu Island, Japan.

He was born May 20, 1923, in Farwell to Jim and Lora Martin. He attended Hardin Simmons University in Abilene, Texas, in 1941-42. He then went into the

Marines and after training he became a naval air cadet.

The Farwell High graduate was 23 and and had been overseas for 10 months at the time of his death.

He received his commission at Corpus Christi, Texas, and was the son of the late J. H. Martin, who served Parmer County as sheriff and tax collector for 12 years. The Martins later moved to Fort Worth, where their son is buried.



#### James C. Bradley

Pvt. James Calvin Bradley, who was with the American captured when the Philippines fell to the Japanese, never came home to tell his experiences.

Although the date of his death is not certain, Bradley was one of the unfortunate prisoners of war who went down in a Japanese ship struck by American shells near the Philippines, when he and thousands of others were being moved to more secure Japanese interment camps.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J.M. Bradley, formerly of Friona and later of Muleshoe.

#### Larry J. Price

No information is available about Larry J. Price except for the fact that he died during the Vietnam War.

A. Thomas Parker

The first Parmer County boy officially reported as killed in action by the War Department was Arthur Thomas Parker, son of Willis Parker, of Farwell, and later, Friona.

A member of the Marine Corps, Parker entered service on Feb. 12, 1942, and met his death not quite a year later, on Jan. 13, 1943, in the furious action to regain possession of Guadalcanal.

The Purple Heart certificate and medal were awarded to Pvt. Parker posthumously, being received

by his father. He was a little over 19 years of age at the time of his death.

#### James B. Harrelson

PFC James B. Harrelson was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Harrelson. He attended school in Pinkton, Texas. He served with the U.S. Army during World War II and died during the Allied invasion of Europe on June 13, 1944. He was 32 years old.

Harrelson was working in Parmer County for Clyde and Owen Seamonds when he went into the service.



M. Vernon Collier

PFC Martin Vernon Collier was born at Ringling. Okla., May 13, 1911. He died May 12, 1944, in the line of duty somewhere in Italy, one day before his 33rd birthday.


He finished high school in Granite, Okla., and attended Chillicothe (Mo.) Business College. He moved to Abernathy with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe B. Collier, in December 1930. He was a farmer.

#### Heriberto (Eddie) Blanco


Heriberto (Eddie) Blanco was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Gonzalo Blanco, of Friona.


He attended school in Logan, N.M., before joining the U.S. Army. PFC Blanco died in Vietnam in 1968.

Ralph B. Miller Jr.

Capt. Ralph B. Miller Jr. was a jet fighter pilot reported missing in action on April 25, 1953.

A "Best All Around Boy" at Friona High, he was an excellent student and avid reader. He won awards in farm skills and many ribbons for his herd of Jersey cows. He was a player on the first Friona basketball team to go to Regionals.

At Texas Tech, he was active in cattle judging and rodeo. He was a member of the first place judging team at Kansas City.

After receiving his degree in 1951, he enlisted in the Air Force as a cadet and received his wings and rating of Jet Fighter Pilot at Bryan AFB in 1952.

Following his death, his family received the Purple Heart of Military Merit and Air Medal and the rating of captain.

A loan fund in his memory was set up in 1954 by the Modern Study Club of Friona.

Floyd H. Cummins

Floyd H. Cummins lived in the Lazbuddie area and died in World War II. \*



#### Horace Coffman

A truck accident, which occurred on Nov. 4, 1944. in New Guinea, took the life of Seaman 2-C Horace (Hob) Coffman, son of Mrs. Arma Coffman, formerly of Friona.

Coffman, 25 years old, donned his Navy blues on May 28, 1944, and received his basic training at Camp Wallace and San Diego. He was overseas for a period of only six weeks when involved in the accident that cost his life.



#### Homer C. Johnson

Pvt. Homer Carrell Johnson was the son of Mr. and Mrs. C.E. Johnson, formerly of Farwell, and who later resided in Chemult, Ore. On May 13, 1945, he was killed in action on Luzon Island.

Johnson was inducted on Oct. 18, 1944, and went to Camp Walters, Texas, where he received training for 17 weeks, and was moved to Camp Ord, Calif., and went overseas from there in April 1945.

Besides his parents, he is survived by his wife and three children.

Vernon Ginnings, son of J.C. and Emma Ginnings, was a graduate of Oklahoma Lane School. He was drafted into the Army on March 18, 1941.

After training at Ft. Bliss, he was sent to the Philippines Aug. 20, 1941. He fought on Bataan and received the Distinguished Unit Citation with Oak Leaf Clusters. He survived the Bataan Death March but died from illness in the Philippines Aug. 23, 1943.



#### **Owen Drake**

Pvt. Owen Drake, formerly of Friona, met his death in the invasion of Normandy, near St. Lo, France on July 30, 1944. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. A.O. Drake.

Entering service in November 1943, Drake was assigned to the 115th Infantry of the 29th Division. He landed in England on July 12, 1944 and hit France on July 18, to meet his death only two weeks later. His remains were buried at a military cemetery at Le Chene, Guerin, France.

In his column of July, 1944, the late beloved Ernie Pyle spoke of "the breakout from our beachhead", in which Drake's outfit participated. Pyle writes "at least paste it (July 25) in your mind. For I have a hunch that July 25 of this year 1944 which will be one of the great historic pinacles of this war."
