Farwell School Counselor Carol Sullivan presented the results of the TAAS test to the Farwell School Board on Jan. 14. The TAAS test is the examination that students must pass before they can graduate in the state of Texas. The exit level of the test will be given again March 31 and April 1 and 2 so that those students who need to pass the a portion of the exit level of the exam are being tutored by Patsy Camp and Vicki Haseloff.
Farwell High School students who took the examination did better in reading than they did in any other part of the 12th graders. Eleventh graders led the high school in writing Writing was the strongest area for 7th and 9th grade students. Math was the strongest area for 3rd grade students.
