These statistics are compiled from service reports completed by the Fire Department and pertain to the annual The Texico ambulance respond during the year．Of these calls， 49 were medical problems， 8 were vehicular accidents， 8 were falls， 2 were violence related， 1 was employment related and 8 were classified as miscellaneous．
The statistic that Texico and surrounding area residents time is the time duration when a call is received by the dispatcher until the ambulance arrives at the scene to provide medical care．Texico＇s average response time is 3.9 minutes．
Seventy－four of the 76 calls were staffed by EMT－IV隹位ians．This allows for a high level of care to be given to patients as soon as possible．These persarnel defribillation and monitoring is in the near future．
