Ine Did; Nine Did Not

L'uke 17:11-19

Teaching kids to say thank you can be an exhausting task of the vocal cords having to constantly reminding them to say "Thank You!" Parents hope that their children will make it a habit of being appreciative. I am sure that many parents' wonder when the habit will begin and how long it will last. Our nation even has a day set aside just to remind us adults of the important lesson of saying the "thank-you's" that parents have struggled to teach us.

Three hundred and sixty five days in a year and only one is designated to make us aware of the many things to give thanks for. I can only imagine what our country would be like if we did not have a day set for us to remember the blessings in our lives. Without Thanksgiving, we might never be aware of the blessings we have. Our thanks to God and others might be fewer and far between. What would happen to the habit instilled in our children if a day of Thanksgiving wasn't set aside for adults to be thankful? I am afraid that the percentages of people giving thanks, to the God that has given so much, would decrease.

God created the world in six days and then rested on the seventh. He took time on the seventh day to enjoy His creation and for His creation to enjoy Himself. He later instructed the Israelites to "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath to the Lord you God." (Exodus 20:8-10a; NIV). He desired that we would use six days to accomplish what we must and then take the seventh day to spend worshipping Him. Our churches would be full and overflowing if His people remembered His day as something special and a time of saying thanks for His creating. The more important that God becomes in the lives of people during the week, the more important the day of worship becomes in those same lives.


Thanksgiving is more meaningful as we approach the holiday with the attitude of worship and praise to the One God that is sovereign in the world and instrumental in our livelihoods. Thanksgiving is best approached when the habit has been in place with the holiday giving opportunity for public expression as a nation, in society, and among our families.

Our country has appointed 1 out of 365 days to be thankful. God asked for 1 out of 7 days a week for corporate worship. The Gospel of Luke records a story of 1 out of 10 men with leprosy that thanked Jesus for the healing that He gave. Luke tells us the story of nine men that did not and one that did give thanks.

Luke 17:11-19 is the account of Jesus traveling to Jerusalem and upon entering a village, He encounters ten men seeking His attention. The ten men have leprosy and shout their pleas as He passes near by. Jesus tells the ten men to show themselves to the priests. The ten men are healed of their leprosy as they travel to see the priests. They realize their healing and continue on and give no attention to what Jesus has done. Only one man returned to Jesus to thank Him for the healing. "Jesus asked, Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine?" (Luke 17:17; NIV). One man thanked Jesus and nine did not.

God has done more in our lives than we know and/or want to acknowledge. What can we, as His creation and objects of His affection, do to be more thankful of His gift of love through Jesus Christ? We can learn some lessons from the leprous men in Luke 17:11-19.

Thankfulness comes as we realize the extent of what Christ has done for us. Nine men were aware of what had happened to their bodies, but only one man was aware that it was Christ that had affected his body. Their



cleansing came not from their hopes, dreams or deeds but from Christ alone. Thankfulness fills our heart and is expressed, as we understand from where kindness originates.

Thankfulness expresses itself in praise and worship. The Samaritan that came to Jesus to say thank-you praised Him with a loud voice and fell at the feet of Jesus in worship. It is at the feet of Christ that we show our readiness to serve Him. Jesus gave this example as He washed the feet of His disciples in the thirteenth chapter of John. It is at the feet of Christ that we recognize the divine work of God's anointed Son. The twelfth chapter of John records Mary anointing the feet of Christ prior to His redemptive act upon the cross. It is at the feet of Jesus Christ that the world sees our love for Him. Again in John, chapter twelve; we see the disciples attention given to Mary's loving act towards Christ. Our thankfulness will lead us to the feet of Christ in worship (Continued on Page 8)

It was a special year for Wolverine **Coach David Lynn**

It was a real special year for Texico football coach David Lynn, returning to the school he had left a decade ago.

This year's squad was state runnerup, an outstanding achievement. This wasn't expected because last year's team graduated most of its starters, including its most athletic players. As Lynn put it, "three kids had some playing time last year."

"Coming in, I felt a lot of uncertainty. But I saw the boys start lifting weights on July 27 and the turnout was good. That participation said the kids had a good attitude," he said.

In football, experience is a critical factor. Lynn saw that early as his team struggled, especially as it looked for a quarterback. He started with what he called a "noble experiment," with Eric Stanley and Ryan Autrey alternating at QB.

In the Wolverines' first game, the team played good de-(Continued on Page 2)

It was a whale of a game, like a roller coaster ride. In the first half, it was all Wolverines, moving out to a 16-0 lead. But in the second half, the Foxes rebounded to come away with a 22-16 win in the Class A state football championship game at Texico on Saturday.

fense but the offense turned over the ball four times. Texico lost.

Next up was Loving. "We won -- our kids showed up. We really couldn't get it done, but we won," he recalled. And he decided to go with Autrey, a sophomore, at QB.

Texico then beat the Clovis JV and Jal, but suffered a crucial injury when Autrey broke his collarbone.

"We tried the Foust boy, but he is young and wasn't quite ready. We had no continuity, and turnovers were killing us," said the coach.

Lynn was told that Eric Smith used to be the scout team's QB so "we just put him into the fire at Hagerman, with just one week's practice." The gamble paid off as the Wolverines improved week by week, winning all their games until the state championship.

"This was the darndest team I have ever seen," said Lynn. "Each week, the kids responded. And the nice part is that the kids genuinely like each other; no petty jealousies. I attribute that to their parents more than anything."

As the season progressed, the "kids started learning how to play defense. If you don't play (remember, only three players had much playing time going into this season), you don't know what to do, like how to get an angle on a ball carrier. But we watched the films and the kids picked up and saw the worth in the little things that if done right can result in wins."

Lynn said he was more pleased with this year's team than any he had been part of.

He put in new systems and techniques. "I never heard, 'We didn't do that last year.' Instead, all the kids were open minded and had good attitudes."

Lynn also is known as a disciplinarian. Not along the Woody Hayes lines, but a coach who believes structure is necessary. "Everybody needs some boundaries. If you deal with kids and don't give them boundaries, they can think you don't care."





started with Ft. Sumner at its own 20 as Texico kicked with the wind. On the opening play, Shay Norvell shot the gap and tossed the Fox runner for a 6-yard loss. That set the tone for the whole first half, as Texico's defense stopped Ft. Sumner in its tracks.

Since Ft. Sumner had to kick into the wind, its punt only traveled 7 yards and Texico took over on the Foxes 30. Eric Smith ran for 17, then for 8 more. Eric Stanley gained 5. And the quick drive culminated in a 1-yard TD plunge by Jake Boazman at 6:30. The Josh Boazman kick made it 7-0.

Josh Boazman tackled the kick returner at the Foxes 19. On the very next play, he also had a QB sack. Then Stanley intercepted at the Foxes 30. Again, Texico moved the ball well on the ground. Stanley ran for 4, then 7 more. Texico moved further ahead on a 25-yard Josh Boazman field goal.

Again, Ft. Sumner started at its 20. Kyle Cain had a strong tackle. Albert Esparza then had a great tackle, causing a 3yard loss and forcing a punt. Texico started at its 26. Stanley raced around end for 22 yards. Mattison Cross gained 5 but Texico was stopped at midfield and punted to the Foxes 19.

Cain had another strong tackle. The Foxes punted. Texico was held and punted. Ft. Sumner tried three unsuccessful passes and punted again. Texico managed one first down, on a run by Smith, then punted to the Foxes 21.

Then Esparza intercepted at the Foxes 37, and ran it all the way in for a touchdown. The kick was wide and Texico led 16zip at 2:28. Stanley twisted his knee during this period, but was able to return to the game in the final quarter, and contribute.


On defense, Trace Lockmiller had a strong tackle.In the entiire first half, Ft. Sumner only managed two first downs -and one was via the penalty route. A bad snap gave Texico the ball at the Ft. Sumner 24 but passes failed as the first half ended.

Texico kicked off to start the 3rd quarter, taking advantage of the wind. Justin Minshew had a strong tackle and Ft. Sumner punted. Texico was stopped and Ft. Sumner got the ball back about midfield. At 7:55, a Fox runner burst up the middle for a 56-yard TD. A run around end gained 2 extra points and the margin was narrowed to 16-8.

Shay Norvell returned the kick 10 yards to the Texico 35. Jake Boazman ran for 15, and Norvell for 11 more. But a run on 4th and 3 at the Foxes 34 was halted. On defense, Norvell and Phil Peabody had a strong tackle. Ft. Sumner got a break when it was set to punt, a roughing the kicker call was made and they got the ball at the Wolverines 27 as the 4th quarter opened.

Ft. Sumner moved the ball on the ground well, and scored from the 1 at 8:57. Then a halfback pass gained two extra points and the game was tied, 16-all.

A pair of fouls called against Texico allowed Ft. Sumner to kick off from the Texico 30. They tried an onside kick, but Jake Boazman recovered it at the Texico 18. Boazman ran for 8, then 4 more. But Texico was stopped and punted to the Foxes 39. Ft. Sumner lost a fumble at the Texico 41.

Stanley returned on offense and immediately blasted through the middle for an 11-yard run. Ryan Autrey, who alternated at quarterback with Smith, then threw a 17-yard pass to Norvell, who made a diving catch.

Then on 4th and 2 at the Foxes 27, with 3:20 left, the Texico run around end came up short. Ft. Sumner then scored on a 73-yard end run at 1:54. The kick was wide and it was 22-16.

Texico started at its 35 when the kick went out of bounds. Ft. Sumner intercepted at midfield and it seemed the game was over. But Texico then recovered a fumble with 52 seconds left and it got really interesting.

A halfback pass from Stanley to Norvell put Texico on the Foxes 31. Then a halfback pass to Smith put Texico on the 12 with 28 seconds to go. But then Ft. Sumner intercepted in the end zone.

Concerning polls, there is an important question one should consider: What was the question and how was it asked? Americans are constantly bombarded with polls showing that peace officers favor disarming the American public. The rank and file peace officers of America are rarely asked their opinion. And when they are asked, the results are never printed in major media papers, nor do they appear on network news.

I will tell you that the vast majority of peace officers in America do support the law abiding citizen's right to keep and bear arms. A few years ago, I told you this and reported the results of the Southern Benevolent Peace Officers Association poll. I have now received the results of the San Diego Peace Officers Association poll. Keep in mind that this is a poll from

the liberal Southern California area. Note also that the questions have been included:

Do you support an assault weapon ban? 17.1 percent yes, 82.1 percent no.

Do you support a limitation on magazine capacity? 16.4 percent yes, 82.2. percent no.

Do you support a law-abiding private citizen's right to carry a concealed weapon? 84.9 percent yes, 14.9 percent no.

Do you believe that armed, law-abiding citizens are a threat to you as a peace officer? 12.1 percent yes, 87.8 percent no.

Have recent gun laws reduced violent crime in your service area? 2.8 percent yes, 94.2 percent no.
