Rev. Randy Gregory remembered

This information came from the Gurnee, III., newspaper involving the recent death of Farwell High grad Randy Gregory:
He wasn't a pulpitpounding preacher. He was gentle, thoughtful. A family man who left the corporate world in his answered a calling to teach the laws of God for and his wife dovoted much of their adult lives.

So those who knew Randy Gregory can't understand why anyone would want to kill the Gurnee man and his family as he spoke in characteristic quiet tones during his weekly sermonette in front of his congregation in a Milwaukee suburb.
But police said that's exactly what Terry Ratzmann did: target Gregory and his son.
It's possible no one will ever know precisely why Ratzmann, a 44-year-old lived with his mother and sister two miles strolled into the hotel church service and opened fire, then reloaded, then opened fire again, killing Gregory, 51, his 16-year-old son, James, and five others, and wounding four others, including Gregory's wife, Marjean before shooting himself.
Members of Gregory's Living Church of God searched the scriptures
for answers.
Obviously, we're asking God, 'How on earth can this happen?' " said J.D. Crockett, director of busi-
ness for the Charlotte ness for the Charlotte,
N.C.-based church of some 7,000 members, and a friend of the Gregory's. "He certainly didn't cause this, but He allowed it to happen. We're trying to wrap our minds around that."
Police said they think
Ratzmann Ratzmann targeted Gregory and his son specifically but chose
other targets at random. Randy and Marjean Gregory both attended Ambassador University in Big Sandy, Texas, in the 1970s. The liberal arts college was affiliated with parent-church Worldwide Church of God until 1993, when it closed.

Years later, after Randy Gregory had settled into a successful career with IBM, the church invited him to minister fullime. Gregory took a pay cut and moved the family to Gurnee. He chose Lake County so he could run the "circuit" of services Wisconsin and Pouthern sometimes on the same day, church officials said. And when it came to disagreement and conflict, Randy Gregory was a peacemaker, Crockett said.

Gregory ran a church summer camp in Missouri, teaching pre-teen boys the fine arts of canoeing and archery as well as biblical lessons.
Crockett worked at the same camp. He said not only was it Gregory's joy
to take his son there, but to take his son there, but for the inevitable conflicts of boys entering puberty. of boys entering puberty. Crockett recalled. "Anything can go wrong with 75 boys, but he was the kind of guy that with a

By now, you should have received a picture with a short note from my sister, Valarie Henneman, to be included in the 100th Anniversary Edition of the Tribune. Squeezing six lives into 15 inches of news space took quite a struggle, but many of the "old-timers" will remember us, as the Dial Family was a fixture of Farwell for 25 years.


All four of the children graduated from FHS, and all four played on the high school basketball teams. The two boys also played football and were involved in the track program. Ronny and Benjy both graduated from NMU, and I attended there one year.
My mother, Clytie Dial, was the Candy-Lady for several years. Our house was right across the street from the school, and we inherited a "candy store" when we bought the house. All the kids could come across the street to buy school supplies, snacks, candy and sodas. She opened the store before school, during lunch hour and atter school. Later, the "store" was actually moved there.
Murray died in 1955 at age 45. Six months later, the house burned to the ground. There was an outpouring of generosity in the community, and the townspeople colShe built the hial Clytie get back on her feet.
awhile She was an office nurse for $\operatorname{Dr}$ Green and may others before she bought Ruby's dry goods store in Texico and renamed it Dial's Variety. She worked at nights and by correspondence on a nursing degree, and had to move to Amarillo for the last year of schooling. She became a Registered Nurse at age 59. Quite an accomplishment, I think.
In 1977, when my older brother Ronny passed away suddenly at age 43, he was brought back from North Carolina to Farwell for the funeral, which was held at the First Baptist Church. The Dial's were charter members of that church when it was first established. The church women provided a wonderful meal for the family, even though the last "Dial" had moved away in 1971. You just can't beat the good folks that live in Farwell.
My younger brother, Benjy, won all sorts of awards for sports at Farwell and at ENMU. He was drafted by Pittsburgh for the pros when he graduated from ENMU in 1966. He played in the NFL for four years, then in Canadian professional football for two more years. He later beche a the suces and athletic director at DeSoto, Texas, when he passed away at age 58.

# BOVINA Proud Home of the Mustangs \& Fillies 

Anne Corn recalls her family's experiences in World War II

From Vickie Burch:
On March 8, students in Mrs. Burch's English III classes were treated to an interesting presentation from former Bovina and Farwell teacher Anne Corn.
The students viewed slides of modern-day Germany while Mrs. Corn described the country, past and present. She told the students about her childhood in Germany and of her family's experiences during World War II under Adolf Hitler.
She told the students that they must appreciate their freedom of speech in the U.S. and explained that because the German people did not have such freedom, they were afraid to speak against the Nazi government.
When the students questioned Mrs. Corn about the concentration camps, she said most German people were not aware of them during that time. She added that many non-Jewish people were also sent to the camps.
Mrs. Corn's family owned a store in Germany and had enough food to eat, but she said that most of the people were on a starvation diet, especially as the war progressed. She also said that her small town was bombed, and members of a family next door were killed.
Mrs. Corn met her husband after the end of the war. He was one of the soldiers stationed in Germany during the American occupation there. Because she had learned English in school, she became a translator for the Americans.
The students were surprised by some of Mrs. Corn's descriptions of Germany and of the German people. They were excited when she graciously spoke a few German phrases for them.
Her presentation showed the students a different side of her native Germany and a very interesting aspect of history, of government, and of people who are so much the
same in all countries.
