## Students learn about 'Reality Land'

Students in Paula Leighton's classes at Texico High School are getting a taste of "Reality Land." They have begun to use Every Student) which is designed to show many aspects of the world of work.
"If we are going to ask children to function in the real world, we've got to give them the tools they need," said Mrs eighton
Each student in the class will create a business to
provide a service or product to the other students in the class. A student must research the business before he gets started by reading books and talking to business owners. A participant needs to find out where to get training and tools financing for his business from a bank, and he must purchase the materials needed to set up the business. Then he needs to begin providing the service to his classmates.
Some of the businesses that the students decided to set up are: telephone company, library, water works, a beauty
salon, bank, jail, post office, and an arcade for computer games. They may think up more as time passes. Each student will be given a "pay check" each week, and

The class set up its own rules, and enforces them with
fines. Everyone must live by the rules that are set up. Many activities are designed to teach that what a student learns in school can apply to the real world.
The program allows a student to accumulate sick leave and to purchase recreational privileges such as playing
games on the computer.
