

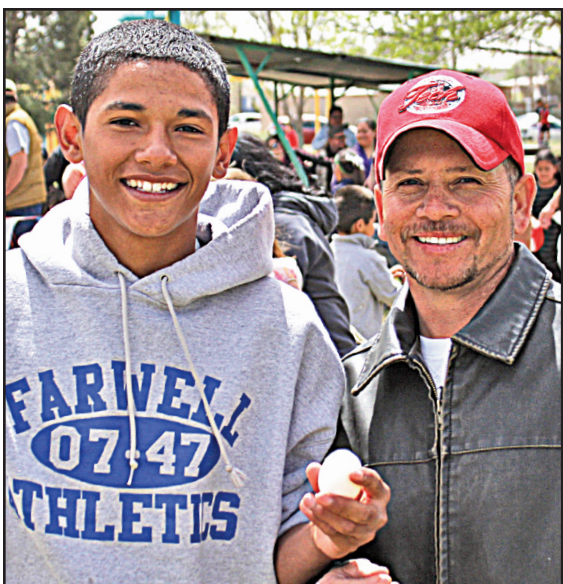


# Egging them on

## Farwell captures UIL District academic title

Farwell High School continues its domination of the District UIL academic competition.

It was the second consecutive year that Farwell won this contest and the 5th victory in the past six years.

Farwell scored 357 points to take 1st place. Plains was 2nd with 326. Sundown was 3rd with 312.

Others were: Sudan, 276; Tahoka, 81; Springlake-Earth, 60; Seagraves, 38; Morton, 32; Olton, 20; and Smyer, 6.

Farwell's One-Act Play's top performance making the difference.

Farwell had team championships in CX Debate, One-Act Play, Spelling and Vocabulary, and Speech.

Placing 1st in their events and qualifying for Regionals were Kolten Morris, informative speaking, current events and computer applications; Luis Delgado, editorial writing; Michele Vega, spelling and vocabulary; and John Ryan Isaacson, persuasive speaking.

## Future of nurse practitioner offices in Farwell discussed

The future of the two nurse practitioner offices at their 3rd Street facility was discussed at the April 5 meeting of the Farwell Hospital District Board.

The board, which meets monthly, did not have a quorum so no decisions were made. Board President Jack Kirkland ran the meeting.

Currently, the building, which is adjacent to the Farwell Dental Clinic in the 300 block of 3rd Street, is divided into offices operated by Melinda Burney and Lacey Meeks.

It was stated that Ms. Burney is now a health care professional in a job in Amarillo and come back to the Farwell clinic "one or two days a week."

Ms. Meeks asked the board to allow her to expand her practice by using the space that is provided for Ms. Burney. Ms. Burney opposed that expansion and contended that Farwell needs at least two health care professionals to adequately meet the needs of the patient population.

The pharmacy annex located at Ms. Burney's clinic also was discussed. For the past several months, this has made it possible for prescriptions written by any health care provider to be submitted at the clinic with delivery in Farwell from a Hereford pharmacy, a convenience residents have used for their health needs.

Also, Jerry Stover submitted a petition he said was signed by 288 persons in favor of a second health care professional coming from Parmer Medical Center (PMC) in Friona and the continuation of the prescription service from Hereford.

In support of the proposal for a second nurse's practice in Farwell, the PMC had personnel attending the meeting to suggest that one of its nurses could pick up the Burney practice and patients in that side of the clinic.

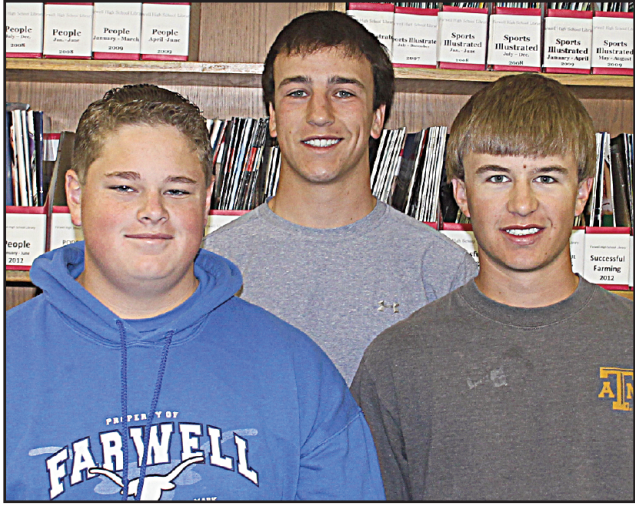

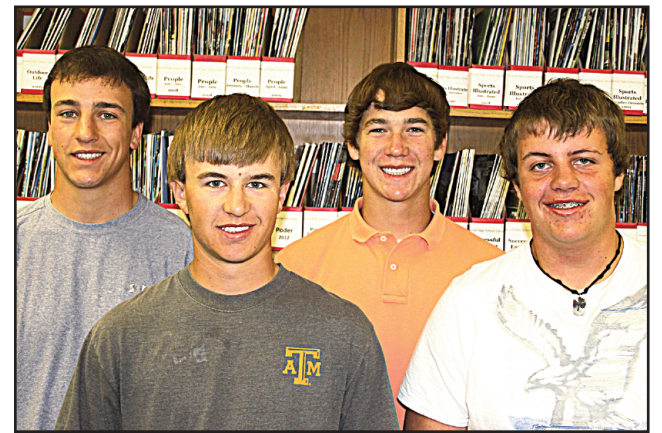

**First Farwell school building was constructed in 1910**

From the 1972 Tribune:

The first permanent school building in the Farwell School District after it was organized in 1908 is being torn down at a cost of \$2,500 and salvage material.

Located on the northeast corner of the school block behind Farwell Junior High School, the building was constructed in 1910 to house students who lived in the newly mapped-out school district. It cost \$20,000 to build.

The building had a slanted roof and was bricked. Apparently, the building had been painted at least twice. No one knows what happened to the slanted roof. Hamlin Overstreet, who attended the first school, said he remembers taking his lunch up on the roof and eating it.

Several years after the building was built, a cafeteria was set up in the basement. It was used until Farwell High School was erected. What was called the high school then, is now the junior high.

Prof. E.A. White was named first superintendent of schools. Minnie Harbison and Prof. T. Guy Rogers were the teachers. Lewis Mersfelder was elected first assistant to Rogers. By 1916, there were seven teachers, including one piano teacher and two manual training teachers.

The first Farwell School Board consisted of J.M. Hamlin, president; Alex Shipley, secretary; E. Shopbell, treasurer; J.M. Kindred, Joe Francis, John Simmons and R.C. Hopping.

Prior to organization of the school district, Farwell students attended school in a rock church. The school board then made provisions for temporary buildings before the first brick building was erected. They were located at the site of the present Farwell School buildings.

Tuition in those days was \$1 a month for 1st, 2nd and 3rd graders; \$1.50 for 4th, 5th and 6th graders; \$2 for 7th and 8th graders; and \$2.50 for 9th and 10th graders, to be paid in advance.

At first, the brick building was capable of housing all students in the school district. But when West Camp and Oklahoma Lane schools consolidated, more students forced a need for more room.

Twenty-one years after the first building was built, the first addition was made. A gym was added in 1931. The home economics department was built in 1934. Other buildings which constitute the Farwell Schools were built over the years.

As more buildings were added, students were divided among the elementary, junior high and high schools.

First, a high school was built (Farwell Junior High now). Then an elementary school was added. Finally, junior high students were moved to the old high school building when Farwell High School was built in 1966.

Since that time, the first permanent Farwell school building had been vacant. The school board debated for some time on its future. There was some talk of a bond issue to get the building demolished, but the price was too high.

So, the school board contacted two Clovis men to do the job for \$2,500 and salvage.

Contacted by the Tribune, new PMC administrator Gayla Quillin said that proposal is under consideration.

Alternative perspectives questioned why a decision that impacts heavily on Farwell residents was being so heavily engaged by individuals and entities from Friona, Hereford and Amarillo.

The question of security concerns for the pharmacy annex in Ms. Burney's side of the clinic also was brought up. It was said that the clinic's proximity to the Parmer County sheriff's office provided sufficient deterrence and that in any case, controlled medicinals were stored in Hereford, not Farwell.

Kirkland expressed gratitude for the input and answers from residents and health care professionals. He said the next hospital district board meeting will be announced publicly for the benefit of clinic patients and area residents who would like to attend.
