## Texico pool may not

 open this yearThe Texico City Council on March 27 discussed the future of the city swim ming pool.
It doesn't look like the pool will be opening this year, and major work will need to be done for it to open in the future.
Street Supt. Darrell Stanton said cracks have formed in the current pool and despite repair work done over the last 10 years, the pool still loses up to two feet of water per night.
The council will look at different options, including building a new fiberglass pool in KKR Park.
Last year, it cost Texico around $\$ 20,000$ to keep the pool open, including electricity, water, and the wages and licenses for the state-required three life guards and a pool manager.
Councilwoman Audrey Kittrell said that when she was young, the city would bus children to Cannon Air Force Base to swim there
In other news, the council
-Passed to keep their CDBG grant.

- Heard from City Manager Carolyn Johnson that part of a $\$ 150,000$ severance tax bond has been revoked by the State to be used in another town.
The city has used $\$ 70,000$ of the money for engineering fees for the wastewater treatment plant.

Discussed the General Obligation Bond that was on the Curry County election ballot this week. The bond will allow Clovis to rebuild their jail and put in a disciplinary unit, a mental health unit, as well as a protective custody unit.

Curry County currently pays $\$ 770,000$ to house prisoners out of county.
The cities of Texico and Clovis currently pay $\$ 45$ per prisoner per day for each inmate at the facility.

- Discussed recreational vehicles in the city and if folks can legally live in them. Councilman Doug Scioli said there is an 800 sq.-ft. requirement for any living unit in town, so most RVs don't qualify.
Councilman Oran Jay Autrey said there are currently two mobile home parks in town that are zoned to also take RVs, but only temporarily

## Mitz Walling was a true horseman

From the 1971 Tribune:

guess I was born loving a horse and everything connected with it, said Mitz Walling, lifelong Farwell Stamford at the age of 55.
He said his love of horses is shared by his wife, Nell, and children, Edith Ann and Milton Lee. His parents were Mr. and Mrs. J.L. Walling, Farwell pioneers.
Mrs. Jimmie Lindsey, Mitz's sister, tells how as a child Mitz always insisted on taking a rope, spurs, bridle and hat to bed with him
"We always tried to get the articles away from him when he went to sleep. But most times we were unsuccessul as leeping," she said.
The first horses Mitz owned were "donkeys," he they were told. In fact, he always had a donkey to ride to school until he obtained a horse at the age of about 10 .
Mitz tells the story of the donkey knowing when it was time to go to the school when it heard the whistle pf the morning train and woulod be waiting at the ot gate for his master.
One morning Mitz didn't reach the lot at the appointed time of $8: 45$ (when the whistle blew), and when he arrived a few minutes later, the donkey was gone.
After walking and running to school to make it on time, he found his donkey waiting patiently at the
hitching rail on the east side of the school building. The first real horse that Mitz owned was a Spanish boogers," said Mitz. He looked behind every bush and bear grass in sight Mitz's next horse wa
vorite of everyone was "Queen." She was soon a on her that I could do on foot, only better," said Mitz. After selling Queen, Mitz concentrated on school and sports. At the start of World War II, while serving in the Army at Wichita Falls, he found the horse he had been looking for
His wife immediately bought him the animal as a gift, and later bought a hand-tooled saddle to complete his equipment. Nell also helped build his first horse trailer.
The horse, "Buttons," soon became a favorite and Mitz caught the roping "bug."
After his discharge in 1945, he entered his first roping event at lowa Park. Since then, he has entered about 200 roping events and rodeos around
In 1954 Mitz was featured in a Spanish magazin long with other Western characters such as Billy lo Kid. The idea was to show what Western life was the K
like.
Mitz attributes his success as a roper to the fact hat he comes off the horse while the animal is still in motion. He also dismounts on the right side of the horse instead of the customary manner in which
most cowboys dismount.
Through the years, he recalls many horses with fondness, such as Pruner, Little Joe and Biscuits. His current roping horses are Hunk and Paint.
Due to the demands of farming, Mitz's profession, he is not able to enter all the events he would like but most weekends finds himself somewhere in the area participating in a roping event, or just at the Farwell Roping Arena for his own pleasure and enjoyment. He is vice president of the Farwell Area Town Days each year. He also rides in area parades and was named "Best Dressed Cowboy" in the Clovis Pioneer Days parade once
Mitz concluded, "If I had never won a prize in my life, I would still be riding and roping as I believe it is a great sport."
