state financial aid to improve its streets. A public hearing was held
Monday at City Hall as part of the process to seek a 1989 Small Citises Community
Development Block Grant Development Block Grant. for council members. And they discussed street paving estimates they had Lydick Engineers, Clovis, draw up for them. talled nearly $\$ 192,000$, looked good to the council. As Mayor Steve Chancy said, any state

made before such work is done.
Lydick provided estimates for this work. 1. Construct 24 " concret 32 feet back to back. 2. Trim the existing asphalt paving to a width of 18 prime with asphalt and pave with a $5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ second course penetration type pavement.
3. Construct a $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ pen etration type pavement over the entire street width between the curbs, that being 28 feet wide.
