

Rodeo!

The 24th annual rodeo will be a special one this time - it will be a full-fledged amateur rodeo.

The rodeo, a keystone of the 25th annual Border Town Days, will be held July 26 and 27 at the newly-refurbished Farwell Arena at 8 p.m. It has been approved by the Texas Cowboy Rodeo Association and the New Mexico Rodeo Association, said Hobbie Coffman, one of the rodeo organizers.

He said events will include bareback riding, calf roping, saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling, bull riding, team roping and barrel racing.

In addition, events will be held for youths 18 and under, including steer roping and barrel racing.

Coffman said 350 to 400 participants are expected. Entries will be taken between noon and 6 p.m. cst July 23 by calling stock contractor Charley Thompson at (806) 794-2317.

Tickets will \$4 for adults and youths 13 and older; \$2 for youths 6 through 12; and free for youths 5 and under. There will be a \$100 beef drawing both nights.

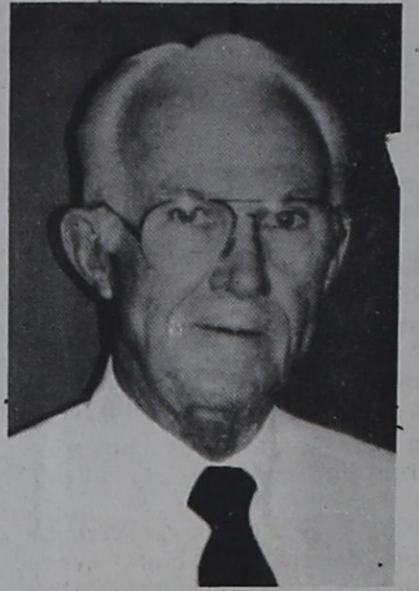
Montgomery named

Bicycle contest registration under way

All area youngsters are reminded that registration has begun for the Border Town Days Decorated Bike Contest at Texico City Hall.

This year offers a special incentive: Ted Lopez, of Tedson Trailers, is donating a brand new bike to the winner of "Best of Show" - the bike judged as best decorated regardless of age category.

This year's BTD theme is "Salute to Our Troops." It's important to follow the theme,

since that is a large portion of the judging.

Also, an anonymous donor has provided funds for cash prizes in each category. And every entrant in the contest will receive a free ticket to ride the Bell Train.

"Everything is ready at Texico City Hall for registration," said Rhonda Qualls, who is in charge of the bike contest.

The registration deadline is 3 p.m. Friday, July 26.

Mrs. Qualls said that youths planning to enter the decorated bike contest in the parade need to register, giving their name and age, to be eligible for the cash prizes and free train tickets.

No motorized bikes are allowed in the contest.

All riders must bring their

Other rules are:

- All participants ride in the parade and must continue to Farwell City Park, and then park their bikes in the park area. A bicycle rack will be provided in back of the First Baptist Church.

- You must be present at the park to receive your cash prize and free train tickets.

There will be two judging divisions:

- Division A: Best decorated bike, ages 7-12.

- Division B: Best decorated bike, ages 6 and under.

Judging will be based 50 percent on originality and theme; 30 percent on neatness, and 20 percent on the use of color.

Judges will be Kenneth Jones, Frank Murray and Lee Malloy, members of the Clovis Rotary Club.

Referendum on tap

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMA) will conduct a cotton referendum July 17-26, in cooperation with the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS). Cotton producers and importers will vote on amendments to the Cotton Research Promotion Order.

The USDA Amendments call for importer representation on the Cotton Board; assessing imported cotton and cotton products, as is done with domestic cotton; increasing from \$200,000 to \$300,000 the amount the Cotton Board can reimburse the Secretary of Agriculture for expenses incurred in conducting a referendum; reimbursing government agencies which assist in collect-

ing fees on imported cotton and cotton products; and, terminating the right of producers to demand a refund of assessments.

Voters may hand - deliver ballots to our polling place, said ASCS official Martin Chandler, "or mail them, postmarked by midnight July 26."

Eligible producers not receiving ballots should contact their local ASCS office. Eligible importers who have not received ballots may obtain them from USDA, ASCS, Attention: Cotton, Grain and Rice Division, P O Box 2415, Washington, DC 20013.

This is the third annual benefit Charlie will be doing for the Farwell Convalescent Center in conjunction with Border Town Days.



Just before serving, fill each tortilla shell with ice cream. Top with hot caramel sauce and toasted nuts.

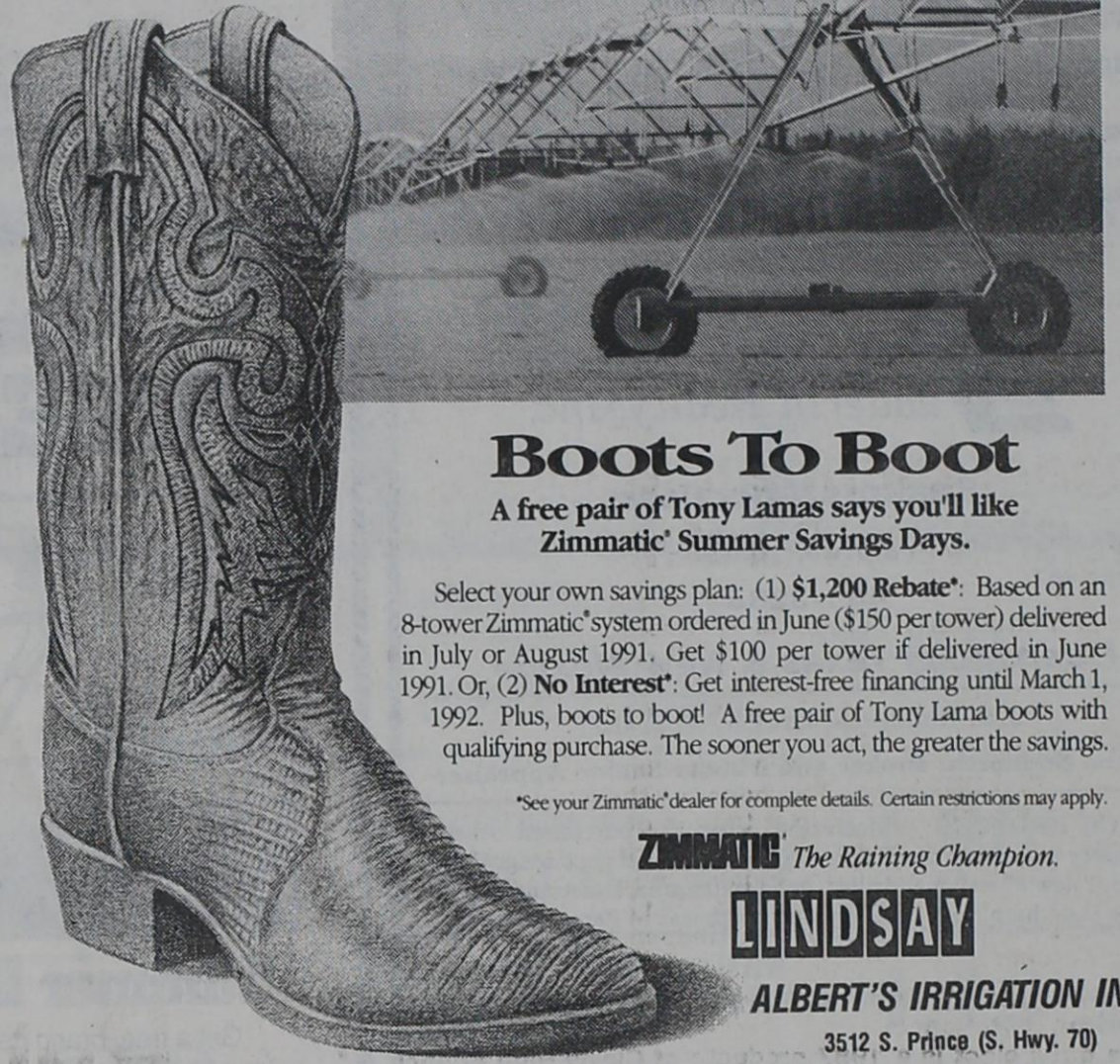

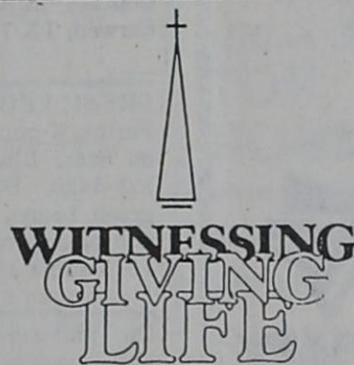
