First, I want to thank all the folks who have called with information about the Parmer County servicemen who gave their lives during wartime.



Three finalists for police post

The Farwell City Council Tuesday announced there were three finalists for the post of Farwell city police officer.

The council accepted the report of its police search committee - councilmen Pat Howard, Royce Bethel and John Carlson, and private citizens Mike and Donna Ratke and Colleen and Jerry Stover.

The group went through 24 resumes, all from men. Howard said he ran background checks on the three finalists and all are licensed in Texas.

The council will invite the finalists to meet with it individually Feb. 6.

Mayor Chris Gikas complimented the committee on its

The council also approved seeking bids on a Ford Taurus as a police vehicle. It will be white with blue lettering - Farwell

School's colors. The first year for a city police department is expected to

cost about \$46,000, including insurances. Salary will be about \$18,000 for the man chosen. A car

will be bought for about \$16,000. The city will use funds in its Certificates of Deposit to pay for the department's start. After a year, the council will have to determine how to continue its funding.

In other business, the council:

- Approved a request from city Fire Chief Joel White to have the city fund between 2 and 4 fire department members to attend a week-long fire school at Texas A & M for them. If those who attend graduate the course, the city receives a fire credit on its insurance key rate.

- Opened insurance bids. But they were tabled so all the bidders could include worker's compensation in their bids. Bids will be discussed at a special council meeting Jan. 28.

- Also at the Jan. 28 meeting, the council will meet with Gordon Smith, manager of TCA Cable to disuss a rate increase. It was noted that there have been some interruptions recently in cable service. This is due to work being done to improve the cable transmission due to FCC regulations, the council learned. The council also wants to talk with Smith about rain problems causing cable outages.

- Received two bids to be the city's bank depository, from Security State Bank and the Farwell branch of Muleshoe State Bank. Security State was picked by a 4-1 vote.

- Approved a request from Border Town Days Committee Chairman Mike Pomper to waive its fee to use the Farwell

- Heard Water Supt. Dee Hammit report that there may be a problem with the addition being built to the Farwell elementary school because there's a sewer line under that school. The council voted to inform the school that an engineer's opinion will be necessary before construction. Even though it's a city school, it's on school property so the council feels the school system should pay the engineer's cost.

 Noted that the school construction includes demolishing the tennis courts, which were built with state funds. The council voted to write to Farwell School officials noting that the school system must rebuild the courts.

- Approved buying a new copier from Hollands. It will cost \$1,500 plus trade-in.

- Approved a building permit, with certain stipulations, for Cecilia Quesada, who lives on Ninth Street, to move a 35' x 50' house from Bovina to vacant lots in the 200 block of First Street.
