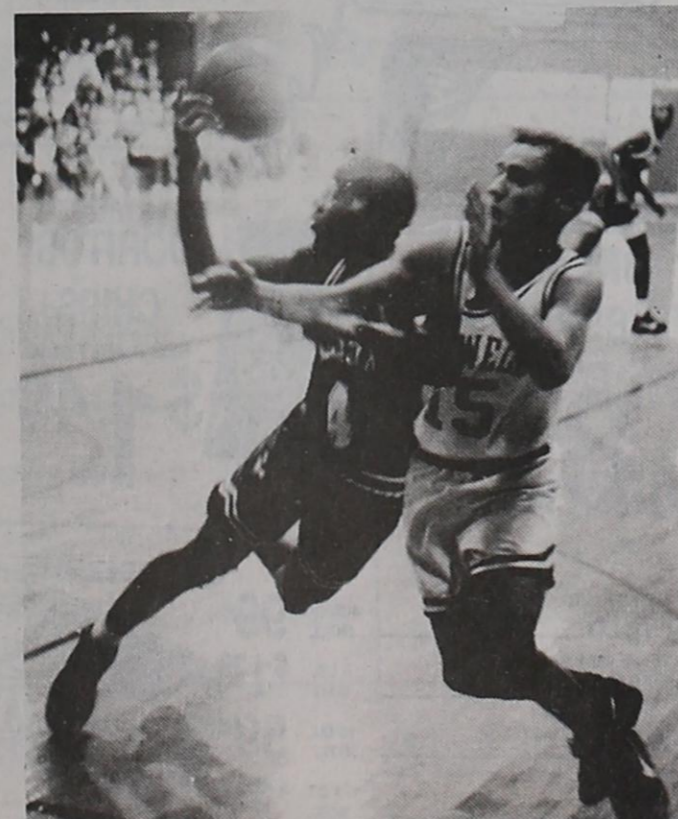
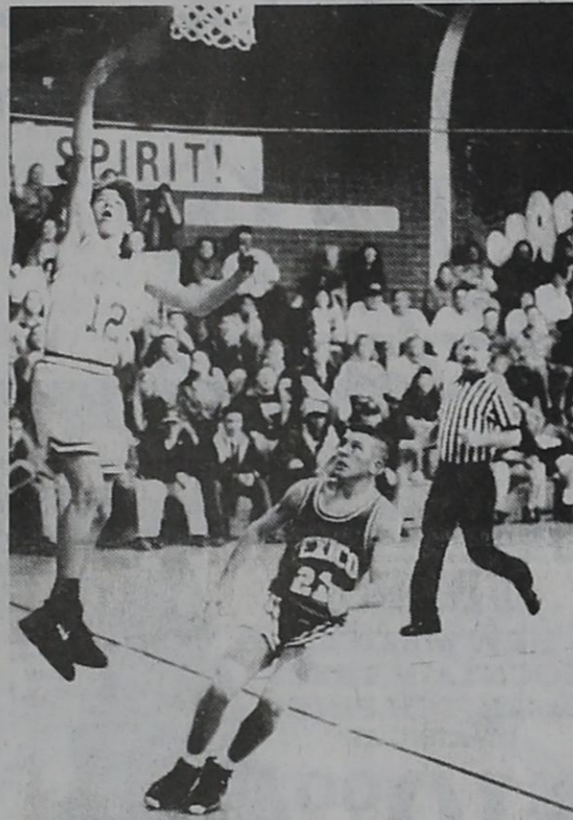

In other business Tuesday, the Texico City Council:

- Heard councilwoman Carolyn Burrows urge city residents to attend the highway department's Dec. 29 public hearing involving the highway widening near the Spur Restaurant (see advertisement elsewhere in today's Tribune).

Mrs. Burrows said traffic signals are needed on Wheeler Avenue (the highway) because traffic has increased and it's becoming difficult especially for youngsters to cross the highway.

One person noted that on "lottery nights," traffic is very heavy.

Mrs. Burrows will contact school officials about coming to the hearing to ask for traffic signals, too.

Traffic signals have been looked into in the past for that area but a problem involves their proximity to the railroad tracks. Inexpensive signals can't be put up; more expensive ones to coordinate with the railroad may be needed.

- Approved a mobile home variance at 319 Garwood. Ten letters were sent out to nearby property owners and four were returned, all favorable.

- Agreed to purchase a software package for the city police department from Access Data for \$2,100 unless Texico Marshal Gil Holguin can find a cheaper specialized package this month.

- Approved a new criminal code which will allow more charges to be heard in municipal court rather than be sent to magistrate court in Clovis.

- Was officially informed that Clovis had accepted Texico's proposal to house dogs picked up here at the Clovis animal facility. There's one minor hangup because one of the charges differs between the two cities and has to be worked out.

- Decided to advertise for an animal control officer. Councilman Max Winkles voted against it, saying he wasn't sure the post was needed.

- Offered suggested for the state highway department's five-year program. Mrs. Burrows suggested drainage problems along Ave. D be recommended. Councilman Ronnie Warmuth suggested KKR Park pond work and curbs and gutters throughout the community.

- Heard mayor Butch Sharp ask for suggestions for the state highway enhancement program. Mike Pomper, a member of the Texico Chamber of Commerce, said the Chamber had talked a couple of years ago about a gateway arch where you enter New Mexico.

- Discussed a sewage problem with Arno Massey on property he owns on Ave. D. He was asked to talk with city engineer Bob Lydick.

- Told city employee Matt Meeks to seek prices for a small facility to house the new air stripper.

- Heard Meeks report that the packet has arrived for lead and copper testing of water pipes in people's homes. This is a new federal program.

1910 cornerstone to be displayed

School Supt. Richard Boothby reported to the Farwell School Board Tuesday that plans call for the old cornerstone taken from the first school building built in Farwell to be displayed in the new gym building.

The 200-lb. granite cornerstone dates back to 1910. It has been stored in the school archives.

Boothby said it will be displayed next to the door that lead into the gym floor. Along side it will be a metal imprint of that 1910 school building.

In other business, the board: - Approved the DARE drug education program for 5th graders for the present school year.

- Approved buying a new intercom system for the junior high. The current one is outmoded.

- Heard High School Principal Larry Gregory report that the band concert will be at 7:30 p.m. Dec. 16.

- Officially approved pulling the Farwell school funds, amounting to over \$140,000, from the county's Permanent School Fund to be spent on the building project.

- Heard Boothby report that the building program is going very well.

Parmer County trial gets national attention

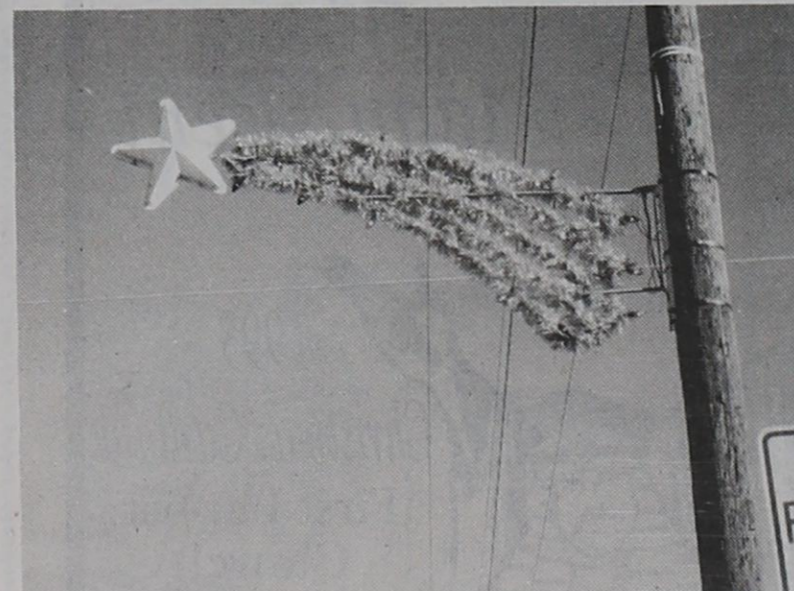
A case which is getting national attention was due to start in 287th District Court in Farwell this week.

Donna Hall 42, faces charges of aggravated assault against her then-husband, Kevin Hall, 37. The couple divorced in August.

The incident occurred Feb. 13 in the Halls' home in the Hub area (eastern Parmer County) in which Donna Hall allegedly poured sulfuric acid on Kevin Hall after the couple had an argument.

Hall suffered third degree burns when acid splashed on her, allegedly when Kevin Hall pushed her away. She was treated at Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona.

The defense attorney for Mrs. Hall has been quoted as saying that Kevin Hall allegedly had a history of abuse against Donna Hall.

'A blue northern'

Walter Curd of Texico reported 4/10" of rain fell at his place on Dec. 12.

The rainfall was accompanied by high winds, blowing dust, and falling temperatures Sunday afternoon.

The storm rolled in behind a bank of blue-black clouds that came in from the north. Dust turned the sky a yellowish-brown color for part of the afternoon.

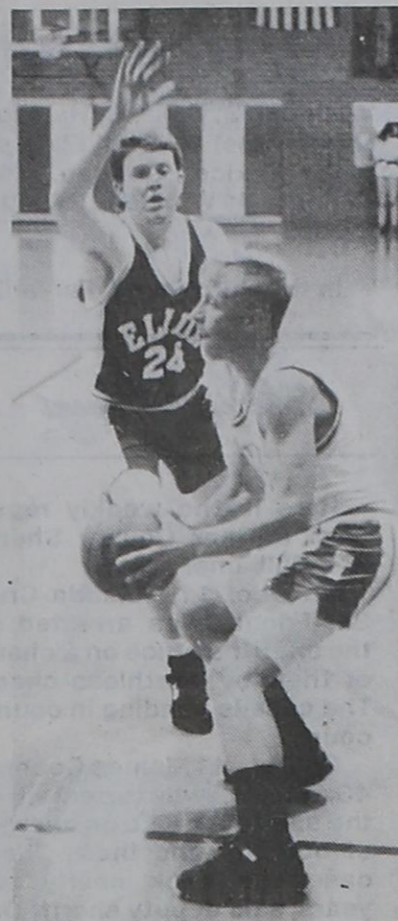

It has been my policy to give warning before I start active enforcement of any group or classification of laws.

Thus, in response to citizen complaints, the Farwell Police Department has conducted several traffic surveys in and around the Farwell Schools. The results of that survey have shown that an alarming number of drivers totally disregard the 15 mph speed signs and/or choose to ignore the stop signs.

The purpose of those signs is to lessen the possibility of causing severe injury or of killing a child. The speed and stop signs are in recognition of the careless and unpredictable nature of a child.

Therefore, effective Dec. 13, school zone traffic laws will be strictly enforced. It should also be noted that the fines for traffic violations in a school zone are much higher than a similar violation that takes place out of a school zone.

I sincerely hope that it is a concern for the welfare of Farwell school children that is the motivation for compliance, rather than a fear of being fined.

I thank all of the citizens of Farwell for your cooperation.

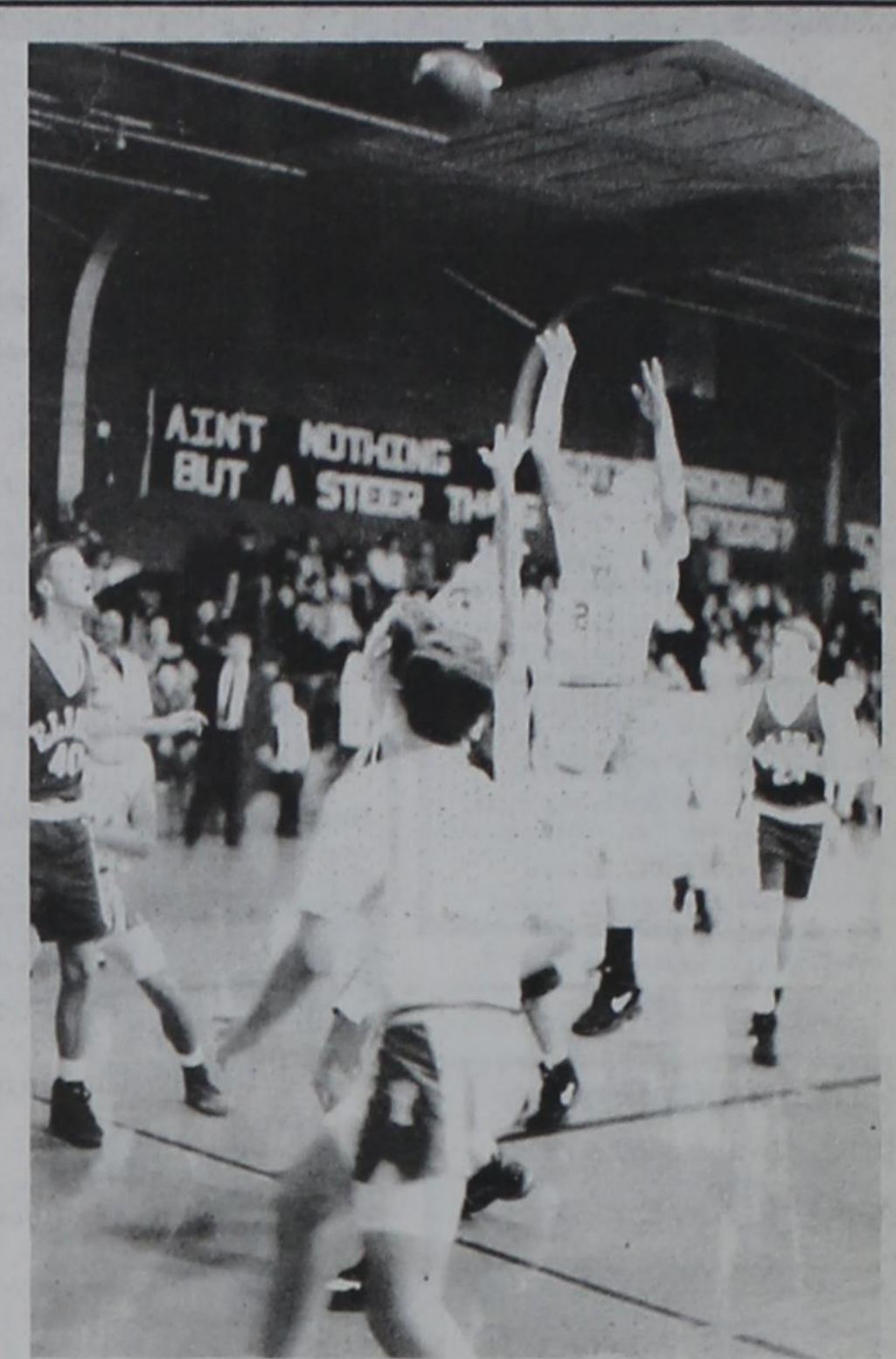

The December U.S.D.A. crop estimate stayed at 3.45 million bales for Texas crop reporting districts 1-N and 1-S according to Lubbock - based Plains Cotton Growers (PCG). Districts 1-N and 1-S are commonly used as a measuring stick of cotton production on the High Plains of Texas.

The December estimate will play a big part in Agriculture Secretary Mike Espy's final decision on the 1994 Acreage Reduction Program (ARP). The preliminary ARP of 17.5 percent was announced Nov. 1. The final ARP percentage must be announced by Jan. 1.

Local churches are preparing for Christmas with a variety of activities.

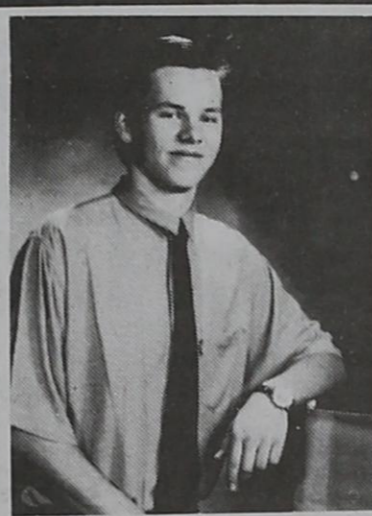
First Baptist Church of Farwell will host a cantata, "He's Magnificent," at 5 p.m. and at 7:30 p.m. on Dec. 19.
