The Court of Appeals，according to the AP report，said there was substantial evidence that Ragland had a verbal con－ frontation with a black student and was later cautioned about using racial epithets；that he was warned to avoid＂bad＂lan－ guage in parent－teacher conferences；and that he used unac－ ceptable language with footbali team members．But the judges said insubordination must be based on a willful refusal to fo－ low orders and there wasn＇t evidence of that．

There was no written policy on profanity in effect during Ragland＇s employment，the court said．Whatever unwritten policies existed，they were not uniformly enforced．

So the court ruled that Texico Schools violated state regu－ lations when it gave Ragland notice less than a month later that it intended to fire him．The district didn＇t give Ragland enough time to correct his performance as state rules provid court ruled，said the AP．
