## Plane crash claims life of Coy Plott

A crop dusting plane crashed just outside of Lariat on CR and Hwy. 84 a little after 6 p.m. on Sept. 14. The plane was piloted by former Bailey County Sheriff, Coy Plott. Plott was critically injured in the crash and later died as a result of his injuries at University Medical Center in Lubbock
The crash took place after Plott's plane hit a high watt radio tower at the end of CR 7 and Hwy. 84. The plane just cleared the home of Matt and Kayla Schilling and lande approximately
field.
Schis
Schilling's farm employee Billy "Mack" Moore and bystander Jay Bowers were first on the scene and were able to pull Plott from the wreckage. Bowers, of Farwell, is licensed pilot and knew exactly how to release the harness to extricate Plott. The two men were able to get him out of the plane and at a safe distance before the plane burst into flames.

The actions of these two men were nothing short of incredible. In fact the circumstances that surround the whole story after the crash took place are also incredible.

It is a sad fact that Mr. Plott died as a result of his injuries, but the coordinated efforts that took place to stabilize, treat and transport him to the University Medical Center are worth of explanation. The simple explanation is that thre community emergency response systems and severa

## Applications accepted

Applications for emergency farm loans caused by drought that occurred from September 1999 to the present are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency in Farwell.
Parmer County is one of 11 counties accidentally left off of the original disaster deby Secretary of A named Dan Gecretary of Agriculture loans to cover part of for production losses from the drought.
FSA Manager Tom Taylor Faid farmers may be eligible for loans up to 80 percent of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent.
As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production o be eligible, said Taylor.
Farmers participating in the federal crop insurance program will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

## Airplane crash

"God-sent" bysta
The technical explanations are really not necessary to go into of the how and why's of the actions taken at the scene. Everything that could have possible been done for Mr. Plot was accomplished by three, very well trained, mostly volunteer, emergency medical technician and paramedic services. The Fire Departments were also vital in their roles at the scene.

The "God-sent" bystanders were Mack Moore, Jay Bowers and a paramedic from Lubbock named Brian Hardin, who jus also happened to be passing by on the highway minutes afte the crash took place. Farwell EMT Jerry Giesbrecht was the first community EMS official to arrive at the scene.

Bailey County EMS and Fire Department were dispatched by the 911 call. Farwell and Texico EMS and Fire Department were subsequently dispatched to respond to the scene.
irst to arive were the Mulesha Fulcher, Brian White and Teresa Mosman met these units on the scene. The Farvell Ambulance arrived just a few minutes later.

Kem Bales, paramedic with the Bailey Co. EMS, saw that within minutes, this was a multi-systems trauma incident and that every person on each unit would have something vital to perform.
"The way that everyone worked together made a very strong impression on me," Bales stated.
Bales also commented that he, as a paramedic actually involved with the patient's care, never had to go search for any supplies, equipment or assistance.

II would just state what was needed and from over my shoulder, or to my side, it was handed to me," he said. "That is very rare for a paramedic to have that much help at a scene and I never had to doubt that someone would be there for assistance."

Doug Scioli, Texico EMS director, felt that this incident jus proved that the people that are trained in emergency medicine are true professionals whether they actually touched the patient or not.
"I was proud that I knew where my people were at all times and that we all worked so well together. Whether it was running supplies to the paramedics and EMT's treating the zones, we all worked in just the right way to keep everyone safe and to assure the best treatment to the patient," Sciol said.
"It also wasn't about which unit was in control and that it was anyone's particular territory," Scioli explained. "We were all there to help a very critically injured patient and we all fell into line together to help him.

Bailey County Fire Dept. were the first responders to the airplane fire. Texico Fire and Farwell Fire Departments were on standby for assistance.

Farwell EMS Director Aloha Fulcher was very proud of the Farwell EMS volunteers that arrived at the scene.
"This type of accident is one that doesn't occur very often I was very impressed to see the professionalism and the quick

"The fact that the volunteers that were working behind the scene (actually treating the patient) so well and so efficiently, made me very proud," she said. "We never had to doubt that the supplies and the scene were under complete control."
All the unit directors would like to thank the bystanders and EMS and Fire Dept. responders for their help and understanding.
"We don't get together to work scenes like this one very often; we don't ever practice together for calls like this one; but even though many of us didn't even know each other at all, we were able to pull together and work out every detail just like we were one big unit, and that is very encouraging to be part of a big 'team' like that," Paul Fulcher, Farwell EMS EMT The
