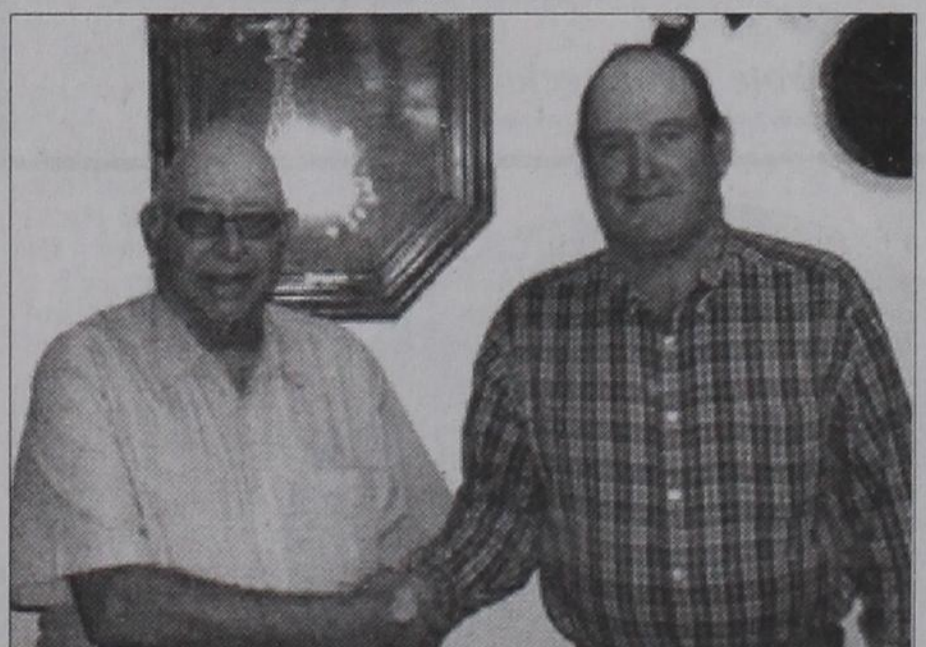

Not satisfied with just the bare necessities, I managed to get a catalog for "army surplus" stuff. What I had been wanting for quite a while, was a "saddle scabbard," so I could carry my .22 rifle with me. (You never know when you'll jump a coyote or something.) I found exactly what I was wanting; a WWI saddle scabbard, so I ordered it. Seems to me that it cost

about three dollars, plus fifty or sixty cents shipping. It came with two leather straps, ready to lash onto the saddle. I'll have to admit, I was a pretty fine-looking specimen of young manhood, with that on my saddle.

Since we didn't know much about the new horse, I rode him and Jimmy walked and led him back to my house. I named him, "Goober." He was a right good-looking sorrel, but he hadn't been gelded yet, so we got uncle Fat to come over and take care of his needed "surgery." I think "ole' Goober" was mad about that for several months. He seemed to have a bad attitude; even kicked at me once. Another time he bit me on the back of the leg, while I was brushing him. (Doggone, horse-bites sure do hurt!) They get your skin between their teeth, then pull until it pops out.) Eventually, he forgave me, and we got along pretty good after that. I kept him until I was nineteen, then sold him for a hundred and fifty dollars, and got married on the money. Best investment I ever made!

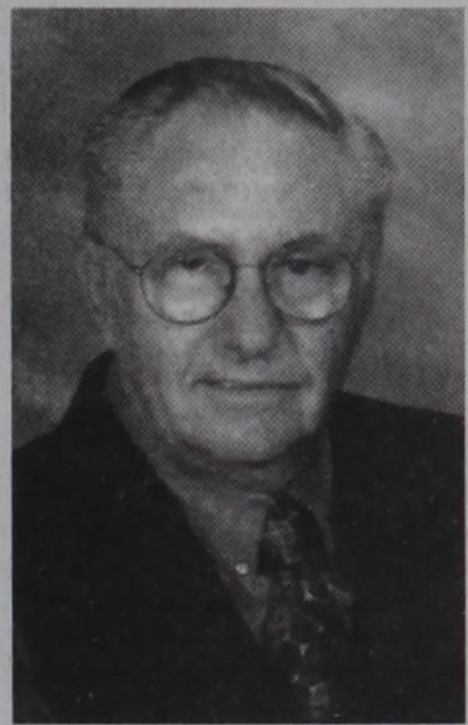

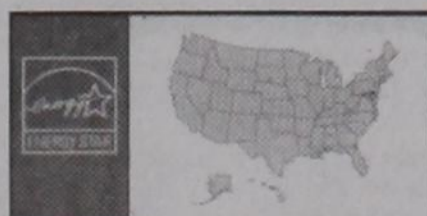
