TESTING THE COMMON FLY

The Communicable Disease Center of the Public Health Service has demonstrated that the common house fly sometimes travels as much as eight miles in search of food. More than two hundred thousand radioactive flies were released in recent tests and then certain traps were set up at various distances from the released points.

While the flight range of flies has been checked by dyes, chalk and enamel, it is believed that radio-isotopes are better because they give off radiation with the aid of which scientists can trace them through complete chemical and biological processes. As a matter of fact, in less than five minutes a few radioactive flies can be isolated from thousands of untagged flies.

These tests indicated that flies move at random from any given location until they detect food or breeding material called attractants.
