## CHAT WITH THE EDITOR

In the anniversary edition of the Wheeler Times, there seems to be some differences of opinion as to the exact anniversary, but December, 1908, the first issue of this newspaper was published.

According to J. W. Hooker, who was the first subscriber to the Wheeler Times, the first issue was published in 1908 and has been a constant since that time.

At that time the fee was one dollar per year. Mr. Hooker re-visited the experience and stated that the Wheeler Times was the "biggest thing I've ever seen."

It is quite sure that it was and is. Mrs. Hilburn realize that the Wheeler Times would flourish and exist.

The publication was known as the "Wheeler Sun" and the location was on the west side of the street where Reid's Barber shop now stands.

According to some of the residents of Wheeler that have been here since the early days there have been a newspaper published here since 1908. But, according to the volume number now being printed in the Times, there have been 40 years of continuous publication.

It was not able to "unearth" from the West Texas dust some of the old publications to see just when the change or error occurred.

According to R. H. Forrester, Mr. Helton was still publisher when he came to Wheeler in 1916. He sold it to Mr. Durkel.

Mr. O. Beene informed me that he came to Wheeler County in 1916. At that time Mobeetie was a newspaper also.

About 1933 the paper was sold to Ted and Percy Bones who sold it to Mr. Andrews.

Mr. Andrews purchased the paper and sold it to Cooper - Clemens and Montgomery with v. C. Clemens as manager and editor in chief.

Mr. Charles Clemens became editor and manager in 1955 and the paper was sold to Alex Hopkins in October, 1957 and then to Don Earle in January, 1958.

Mr. Jack Shelton purchased the paper and sold it October 1, 1961 to Stas and Victor Porter.

Looking back through the file I noted many interesting happenings through the years and that a newspaper makes a very good city diary.

## WHEELER SPLITS 2 GAMES WITH BRISCOE BRONCS

The Wheeler Mustangs found the weather almost as cold inside as it was outside Tuesday night for the first half as the high stepping Broncs from up north jumped to an 11-5 lead by the end of the first quarter and stretched it to a 21-12 half-time advantage.

After intermission Burnett's Chargers came back to hit eight points while the cold-offed Briscoe lads had trouble in finding the bucket and the score was narrowed to 21-20. By the end of the third period Wheeler led 29-25.

The enthusiastic fans were brought to their feet many times in the exciting fourth quarter as both teams put up determined efforts to win the conference contest.

With 42 seconds remaining on the scoreboard and the score tied at 43, big Neil Rogers was fouled while shooting so by cashing in on the three pointer, the Mustangs took a 46-43 lead. However, the fighting Broncs never gave up and Tommie Hays hit a jumper for a 46-45 Count. Dunk Porter was fouled and hit two charity tosses for the 48-45 victory.

Dunk Porter of Wheeler and Bob Swift of Briscoe shared scoring honors with twelve each. Mendall Hunter, Neil Rogers, and Randy Callan had eleven each for the Mustangs, while Kent Sims hit three.

Ronnie Hays hit eleven for the losers; Tommy Hark and Joe Hendrick had eight each and Arville Atherton had six.

Coach Jack Webster's girls, led by the almost infallible Cheryl Wheeler with 18 points, proved too much for the Mustangettes as the Briscoe lassies took a 38-23 win. The rest stops, 15-12 and 21-18 at the rest stops. But the polished outfit from Briscoe land went wild in the final frame and outscored Wheeler 17-5.

Wanda Pierce led Coach Helton's crew with 12 points, followed by Carol Gandv with 8, Lynda Beatty had two, and Estelle Fillington had one.

Other scorers for Briscoe were Winnie Smith and Mickie Fulk with eight each and Lou Meadows with four.

Both Wheeler teams met teams from Rom, Okla., in the Samnor wood Tournament Thursday (tonight) night.

## RESIDENT OF MANY YEARS DIES; SERVICES WERE HELD HERE LAST FRIDAY

Funeral services for Cam Austin, long time resident of this area, were conducted Friday at 2 p.m. at the Nazarene Church with the pastor, Dan Hoover, officiating.

Lawrence Cameron Austin was born in Stephens County, October 20, 1887. He had resided in Wheeler County 45 years having moved here from New Mexico on December 23, 1938.

Mr. Austin had been engaged in other occupations but was principally known as a trucker.

After having been in ill health for several years and seriously ill for several weeks, Mr. Austin died at his home at 1:15 p.m. December 5th. He was 75 years, one month and 15 days of age at the time of his death.

Serving as pall bearers were Johnny Reed, Otis Reed, Leonard Reed, Wayne Edwards, George Warren and B. F. Meadows, Jr.

Survivors include the wife, Cleary Austin, of the home; two brothers, J. R. Austin of Wheeler and N. R. Austin of Plainview.

Three brothers and three sisters preceded him in death.

Interment was in the Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Kirk Funeral Home.

The Board of Directors will have a breakfast meeting Monday at 7 a.m. at Nora's to elect the officers for the coming year. It is very urgent that every director be present.

## FARMERS URGED TO REGISTER FOR WHEAT ACREAGE

The deadline for signing up under the 1963 Wheat Stabilization Program is December 14th for farmers in the winter wheat area.

Since the Wheeler County Cotton Harvest season is still in full swing we felt that this would be the time to remind farmers of the final deadline.

Farmers who participate in the 1963 program will be eligible to receive special payments for voluntarily diverting a part of their allotment or base acreage from the production of wheat and devoting that acreage to a conservation use.

They will also qualify for extra price-support payments and for the regular price-support loan or purchase agreements.

Under the voluntary wheat reduction program farmers may divert from 20 to 50 percent of their Wheat allotment or base acreage with special diversion provisions for small farms. The diverted acreage must be devoted to an approved conservation use.

Growers are cautioned, however, to sign up for only the amount of acreage they intend to divert from 1963 production. Failure to divert the full acreage signed up would result in loss of diversion and price support payments as well as loss of eligibility for the regular wheat price-support loan or purchase agreement.

Complete details on the 1963 wheat stabilization program are available from the Wheeler County ASCS office. Growers are urged to visit their county office before the December 14th deadline if they have questions about the program.

## COTTON HARVEST IN FULL SWING IN WHEELER CO.

The gins in this area have been working around the clock for the past week to take care of the cotton farmers during this fine harvest weather.

According to a spokesman for the Wheeler Gin a total of 1320 bales had been processed at noon Wednesday. At this time last year 1955 bales had been ginned.

The Tindall gin at Kelton reported Wednesday that 1101 bales have been ginned.

Fat Jones is manager of the Wheeler Gin while Garland Abernethy manages the gin at Kelton.
