County Agents' Reports

The U.S. Department of Ag. today warned farmers against grazing livestock on harvested cotton fields that received pesticide treatment late in the growing season. The likelihood of residues in milk or meat from animals grazed on cotton fields after harvest is further increased by late season use of insecticides, defoliants and desiccants.

Many of these pesticides carry a livestock grazing restriction on their labels. This restriction states that fields treated with such pesticides should not be grazed by livestock. Violation of this restriction may result in meat or milk containing illegal pesticide residues and possible seizure.

Federal regulation require that all pesticides moving in interstate commerce be registered with the Secretary of Ag. These products must be formulated and labeled so that they meet Federal standards of effectiveness and safety when used for the purposes approved in the registration. The regulations are administered by USDA's Ag. Research Service under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

USDA has asked the help of State Extension Service and State Department of Ag. in cautioning farmers against grazing livestock on harvested fields that have been treated with pesticides.

Is Breakfast Worth the Trouble
 Do you wonder why your child's marks are lower in the class period right before lunch? Ask yourself these questions: "What kind of breakfast did I give him this morning? Did he get up in time to eat?"

Nutritionists report that children are more likely to do well in studies and games if they eat a good breakfast. So why not back your children up with a good breakfast every day and you'll not only be starting them off right in the morning, but you'll be helping them develop a habit valuable to them all their lives.

Good breakfasts don't just happen, of course. But if breakfast a problem at your house, don't give up--try to solve it. Careful planning will help.

If the family eats at different times, or if a child must be left to eat breakfast alone, keep ready-to-eat foods on hand or foods that receive the \$5,000 cash awards.

The awards for outstanding service to rural life improvement in the state will be presented to a junior farmer who is 35 years of age or younger and to a senior farmer who has passed his 36th birthday. The honors will be conferred upon them during Texas Research Foundation's Annual Field Day and Awards Dinner at Renner on Wednesday, May 18, 1966.

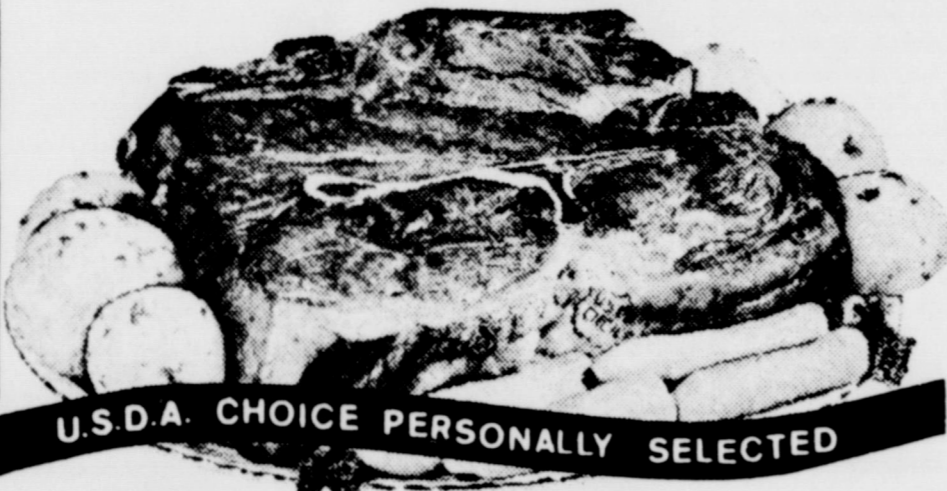

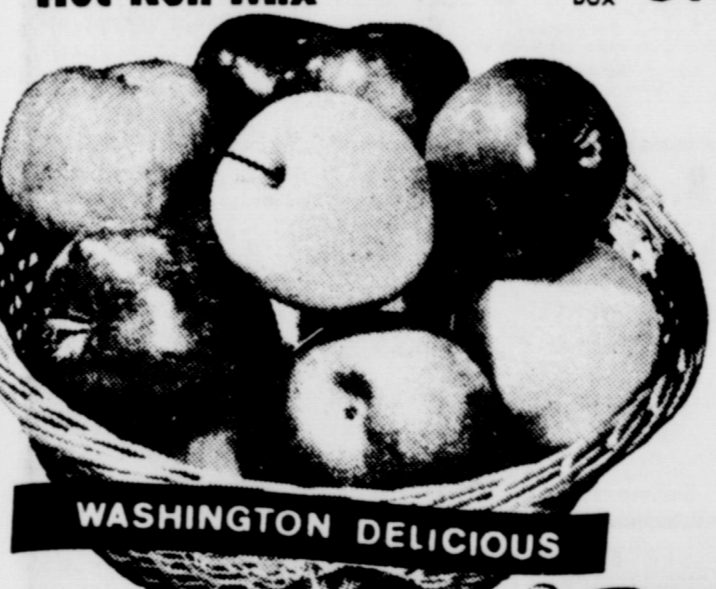

SOIL CONSERVATION NEWS

In the last few days Soil Conservation Service technicians have assisted the following land owners and operators in developing conservation plans on farms; Mrs. Bessie Megee, C. Helton and Von Lister. Mrs. Megee plans to build a diversion terrace, waterway and standard terraces. She also plans to drill a well and install a watering trough. Helton plans to build a system of standard terraces. Lister plans to build some more terraces in addition to the ones he already has.

Technicians are also in the process of assisting H.N. Miller in developing a Great Plains Conservation Plan on his farm. He plans to do some range seeding and brush control. Don Farney is also developing a Great Plains Conservation plan on his place that he recently purchased. In this plan range seeding, brush control and a sheep pen are included.

Preliminary planning is underway to construct a way and parallel terraces on the south edge of Wheeler. The Fred Waters farm at the south edge of Wheeler. The farmers should look into the possibility of constructing parallel terraces on their farm. They are more costly to work than the standard terraces as most of the rows are eliminated. They are also just as effective as erosion control practices. The technicians of the Soil Conservation Service assist the Wheeler County Soil Conservation District and they will help with erosion problems.
