High School in 1988. She attended Amarillo College and now W.T.S.U. Charlie graduated from Wheeler High School in 1987 and is going to W.T.S.U.

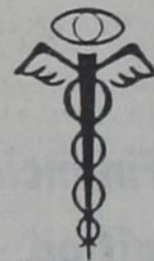
The couple plan to live in Amarillo and continue their education at W.T.S.U. Nicole's major is elementary education and Charlie's major is in agriculture.

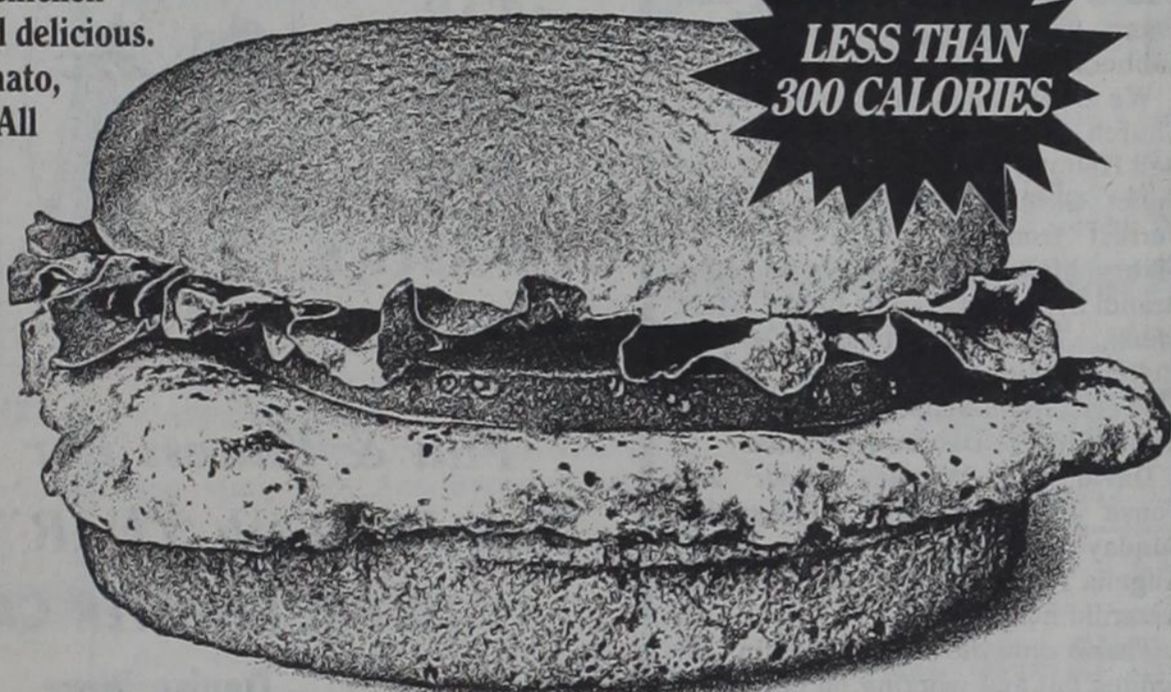

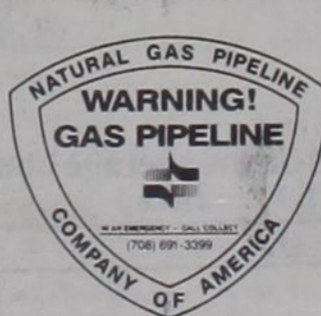

Hurricane Diana, Marianda and Mechelle said oh my mother name.




