From The Minister's Desk:
There is a relatively unknown poem that reads: "The fatted calf, and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found." And they began to be merry. (verses 20-24)
While this parable illustrates several important aspects of Christianity, the most obvious aspect is the forgiveness of God. This forgiveness is clearly illustrated by the father running to meet the young man when he saw him returning home.
And notice that the father did not require the young man to make restitution before he could be forgiven, illustrating that the forgiveness of God is not conditioned upon people's ability to compensate for their past actions. According to the New Testament, "God is not one to show partiality..." which means that if God requires restitution for some sins he requires it for every sin. And a little logic reveals that it is impossible to make restitution for some sins. For example, how does a murderer make restitution for a life that has been taken? How does an unwed mother make restitution for an illegitimate baby? How does a thief return stolen property to someone who has died? Since it is impossible to make restitution for these sins, is it impossible for God to forgive these sins? Absolutely not! It is completely possible for God to forgive these sins or any other sin. His forgiveness is conditioned upon an obedient faith in the atonement of Jesus Christ not upon the ability to make restitution for the sins that have been committed. (Titus 3:5-7)
Like the father in the parable, God does not demand restitution for the sins that have been committed. He simply offers forgiveness. And He will run.
