

Lower Natural Gas Prices To Be Reflected In Xcel Energy Bills

Winter fuel prices down despite

planned fuel surcharge Xcel Energy 'customers in Texas will see lower electric costs beginning Nov. 1 as bills begin to reflect lower natural gas fuel costs, which will help keep Xcel Energy prices among the lowest in the state.

The company filed two fuel cost-related proposals on Tuesday with the Public Utility Commission of Texas - a winter fuel cost factor and an additional fuel surcharge to collect under-recovered fuel costs from earlier in the

The two fuel charges will reflect two different time periods— the winter fuel cost factor will collect

projected fuel costs from Nov. 1 to six months out, while the surcharge reflects actual fuel costs. from a past period (in this case October 2007 to August 2008) that were never recovered on customer bills. The forward-looking fuel factor is a decrease and the surcharge from past fuel costs is an increase, but the result will be a net reduction in overall bills.

Xcel Energy's proposed winter fuel factor will lower an average bill of 1,000 kilowatt-hours by 8.86 percent, or \$8.96, during the months of November and December. The surcharge, set to begin in January and last for 12 months, will raise average bills by 6.17 percent, or \$5.69 per month.

Changes in fuel costs do not relate to a proposal to raise Texas base rates, which recover (nonfuel) operational and maintenance expenses. Texas communities served by Xcel Energy, along with the PUCT, are in the process of examining the base rate proposal. A decision on base rate changes is not expected before the end of

"Setting these prices is a complex process, but it is important for customers to see all the moving parts," said David Eves, president and CEO of Southwestern Public Service Company, an Xcel Energy company. "Fuel charges can be especially complex when commodity prices are volatile, and we are hopeful we can refine our system to iron out some of these highs and lows."

Eves pointed out that fuel charges are pass-through costs that pay for power purchased from outside providers, and to purchase coal and natural gas used to generate electricity at Xcel Energy-owned power plants in the area. The company does not mark up fuel costs, and only earns revenues on energy charges set within the base rate.

FIRE **PREVENTION** Every day somewhere in our state or nation, fires claim lives, destroy homes and reduce valuable natural resources to smoldering ashes. This year's National Fire Prevention Week (October 5-11) marks another coordinated effort by metropolitan, volunteer and

attention on the importance of fire prevention in the home, on the job and outdoors. Though the theme for the national observance is "It's Fire Prevention Week, Prevent Home Fires," wildfire prevention also plays a very key role here in Texas in preventing the loss of homes and other improved property, as well as natural resources, said Bruce Woods, head of the mitiga-

tion and prevention department of

the Texas Forest Service.

"One only has to look at the first half of this year to see the interrelationship of structural and wildland firefighting. Firefighting resources from around the nation were mobilized to Texas to help reduce home and natural resource losses," Woods said.""Practicing fire safety indoors and out can prevent most structural and wildland fires from occurring and sparing individuals and communities from damage and loss.

Assistant Fire Chief Duane Freeman with the Lufkin Fire Department echoed the need for fire safety in the home and out.

"While too many home fires still occur due to carelessness, the good news is that many are easily preventable," Freeman said. He enumerated several precautions that can reduce the likelihood of home fire damage or

★ Avoid overloading extension cords or electrical outlets. Replace damaged electrical cords and use extension cords for temporary wiring only.

* Never leave food cooking on the stove unattended.

* Store flammable liquids in outbuildings away from gas water heaters and other ignition

★ Make sure that you have smoke detectors installed, replace batteries with each time change and regularly check to make sure

that detectors are working. * Keep flammable materials away from ignition sources, such

as space heaters or candles. Implementing fire safety precautions outdoors is just as important, said Woods. Helpful fire prevention tips he suggested for the outdoors include:

★ Establish wide control lines around burn receptacles and brush piles to be burned to help keep possible flying embers from

reaching flammable vegetation. ★ Dispose of smoking materials in vehicle ash trays to help prevent roadside wildfires

* Crushing smokes and matches in bare soil to help prevent fires caused by outdoor us-

* Avoid driving or parking in tall, dry grass.

* Build campfires in open, level spots away from trees and overhanging branches. Keep fires small and extinguish them cold to the touch before leaving.

Both Woods and Freeman agree that it will take a concerted effort by everyone - young and

- to avoid senseless destruction of lives, homes and the natural resources upon which many people and animals depend for their food and shelter.


"Please help your local firefighters protect your lives and property," Freeman said. "Practice good fire prevention both indoors and out. It's far less expensive to prevent fires than it is to replace property damaged or destroyed by fire, and some things just can't be replaced.'
