take another dip into Eastlanders' pocketbooks beginning June 1, as the result of action here this week. Rates for most city services

are going to have to be raised with the biggest increase coming for water, as the result of an increase in costs to the city by the Water Supply District.

The District has had to raise their rates to the cities (Eastland and Ranger) because of heavy expenditures for major capital equipment called for by various health regulatory aut-

A trio of District board members appeared before the Eastland City Commission Monday evening and explained the reasons for the increase (the first since 1973), and "hoped that further increases will not be needed soon.

Water District Spokesman H.T. Wilson, accompanied by Members M.H. Perry and Bruce Pipkin, reported that rates for Ranger and Eastland

June 1, as follows: basic monthly minimum from \$3,743 to \$4,500, and from ten cents per thousand to 13 cents per

The district was established in 1952 and has the contractural responsibility to deliver up to 1,800,000 gallons a day to each city at a prescribed pressure.

The expenditure of some \$100,000 to meet requirments has depleted the District's reserves and the accounting firm has recommended these

The City has no recourse on the rates and immediately followed suit in raising water rates to its customers to coincide with the June 1st date. All commissioners were pre-

Beginning with the June billing the minimum rate will go from \$4. to \$5. with the gallonage remaining at 3,000.

The rate for water for each thousand over three, will go from 55 cents to 65 cents, and from 50 cents to 60 cents for

City Rates To Increase June each thousand over ten thou-

> Out-of-city limit water custo mers' minimum will go from \$7 to \$8.50 (3,000 gallon minimum) and from 55 cents to 70 c for each thousand over the mini-

> Because the sewer and water fund accounts have been extremely close for the past several years, the commissioners also agreed to raise the sewer rate from a basic \$1.25 a month to \$2.00, and the trash haul fee from \$1.50 to \$2.00.

Increases in minimum wages and workmans compensatin rates, plus increased costs in material has resulted in near and actual deficits in these accounts during the past 18 months.

The city rate increases will raise the minimum from \$6.65 to \$9.00.

Elmer Foster of the Farmers Home Administration visited with the commission about various projects under consideration and Mike Collins, J.D. May and Bob Phillips visited to discuss the housing development south of Crestwood.

The commission voted to table for further study a proposal for a city electrical code, and adopted a one-year ban on trot line fishing at Ringling Lake to protect spawning fish there.

City Sales Tax Rebates Received

Comptroller Bob Bullock said May 14, his department had collected nearly \$1 million in sales tax judgments in the 16 months since he took office. This is more than was collected during the previous eight

judgments were against hard - core delinquents who refused to pay until we went into court against them,' Bullock said. "They used to be considered uncollectable. Now we're starting to cash them in."

Mr. Bullock also mailed checks totaling \$9.1 million to 599 Texas cities and towns, representing their May City Sales Tax rebates.

Bullock said he has remitted \$96.5 million so far this year to the 845 cities collecting the one cent city sales tax.

Cisco received \$1,457.77 for the May sales tax rebate and Eastland received \$2,864.44. Gorman received \$ \$524.68 for their rebate and Ranger received \$1,572.49.



Eastland County Water Supply District currently bills the ity of Eastland a fixed fee of \$3,743.00 per month plus 10 c per m. for all water consumed. In the fiscal year 1974 and 1975 which was a year of low consumption, the total bill amounted to \$77,822.00.

The proposal of Eastland Water District to raise the fixed fee to 4,500.00 per month and the cost per M. to 13 will cost an additional \$1,657.00 per month or have an annual projection of \$19.884.00. The City of Eastland is

currently billing a total of 1,537 accounts. By increasing the minimum of \$4.00 to \$5.00 per month a monthly revenue of \$1,537.00 would be realized. The annual amount of the \$1.00 per meter increase would amount to \$18,440.00. This would still require some \$1,440.00 raised on an annual basis to achieve a break even

position. An average of 3 typical months billing revealed that 9.497,733 gallons were billed over the minimum for each month. By a 1 c per thousand increase the revenue can be increased \$94.98 per month. Additional revenue can be calculated easily by 1 c per M additions to the water billed over the minimum per month.


