the fish are not killed by weather.
Biologists working on our northern lakes last summer picked up these minnows frequently but upon seining this spring, after winter had, have been unable to catch which indicates that they killed out during the winter.
"These minnows occur in five fish in Lake Walt and Lake at Del Rio and Falcon on the Rio Grande. They have been ever present in those lakes and notwithstanding they have been able to produce crappie fishing, catfish and as far as we can ascertain the minnows have not hurt of the fish population by present in the lakes.
"I might also add that the U.S. Fish Commission is powerless to stop their transport even if we felt that they were detrimental."

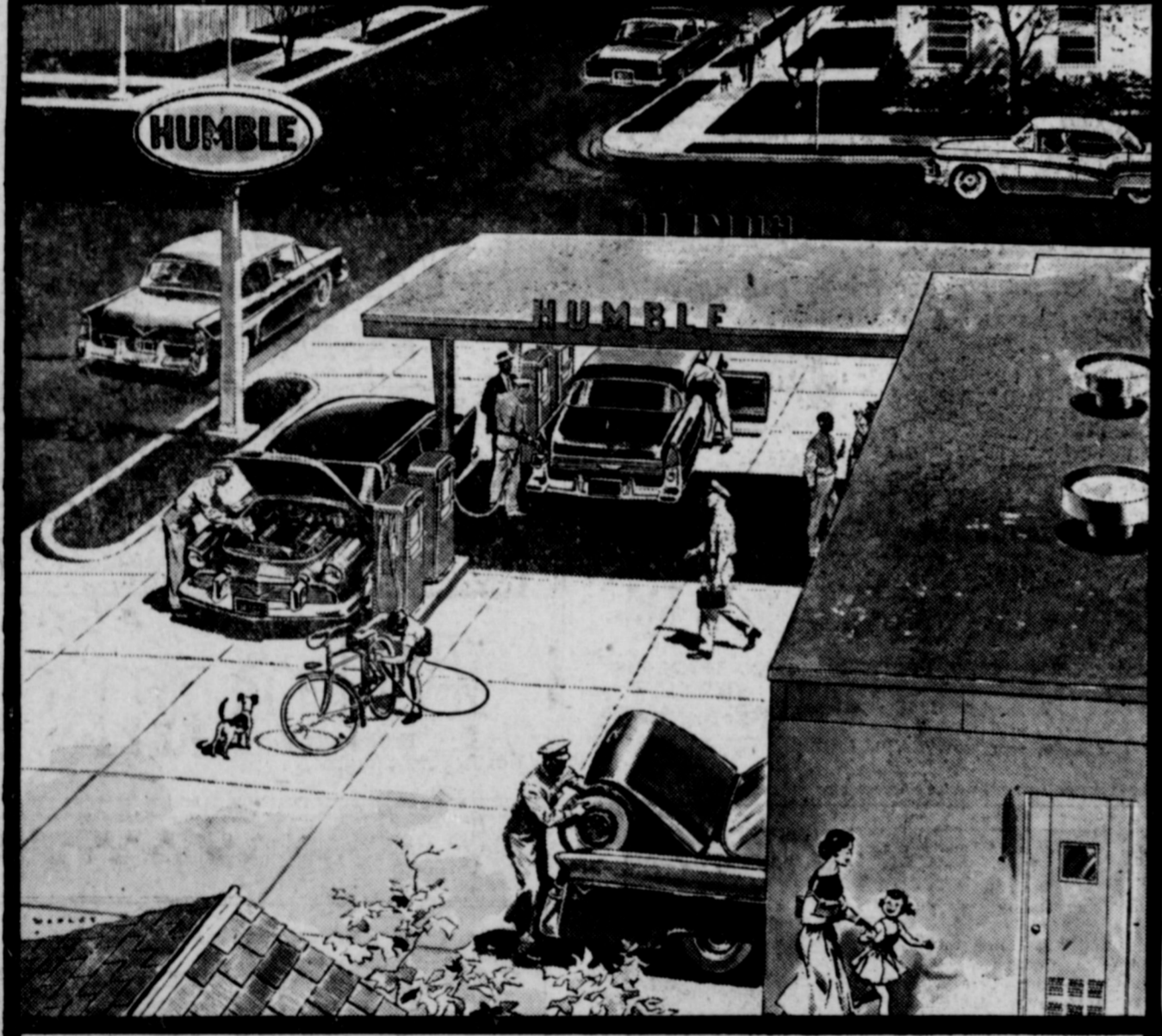

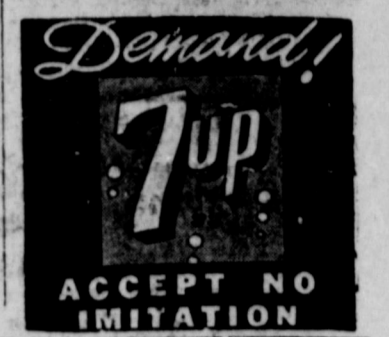

Kincaid, who is at present feeding breeder turkeys with his forage, says it increases their egg production, fertility and hatchability. He said he saves at least 20 percent of his feed costs, and believes the unit—which cost \$2570 plus \$200 for an air conditioner—will pay for itself in the first year. The machine is on display at Kincaid's, and you can stand and practically watch the factory "produce."

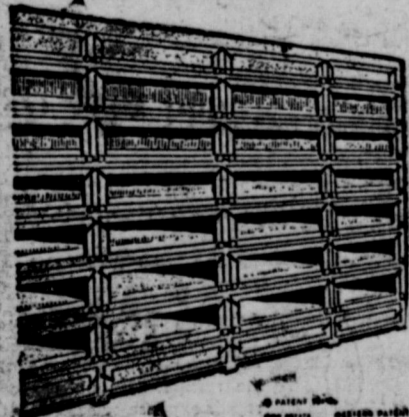

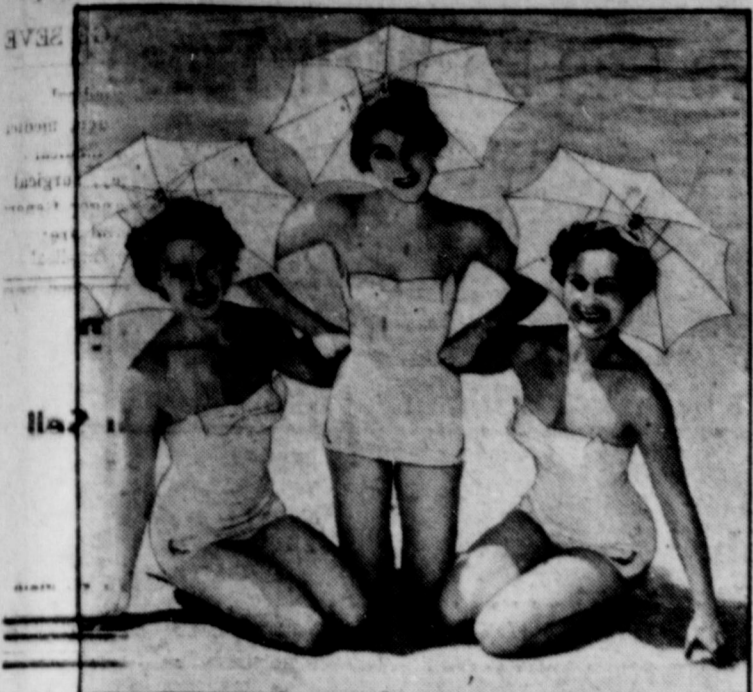

Smith of Virginia. It is an effort to redefine the basic concept and the historic doctrine of States' Rights. The essence of the measure provides that in the absence of a Congressional declaration depriving States of passing laws on a particular subject, and in the absence of any conflict between the State and Federal laws, the States will be presumed to retain the right to enact and enforce similar laws.

The Smith Bill is highly important piece of legislation. It should be passed before the end of this session of Congress to guarantee States their proper legislative power.

If HR 3 becomes law, and we as citizens look less to Washington for Governmental help of some kind, States' rights will be more secure.

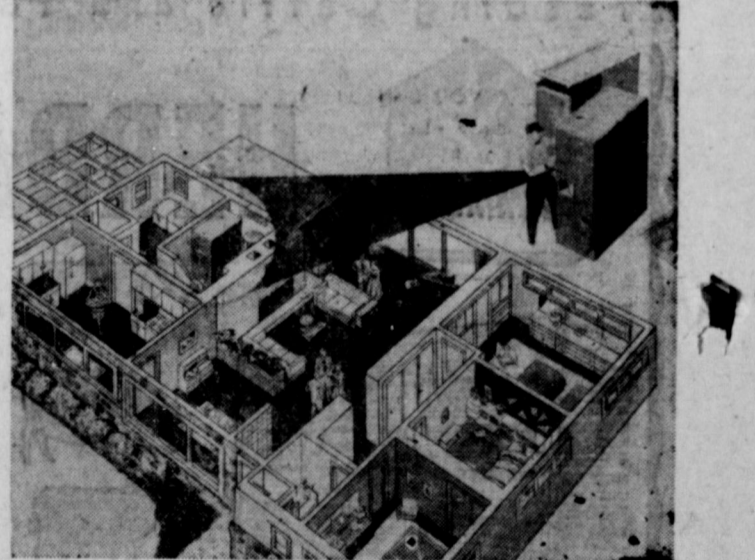
