A BIBLE THOUGHT FOR TODAY

| Rep. Hatton W. Sumners of the Dallas district is chair man of the important house judiciary committee. He at- tended the Dallas conference of 1200 business leaders and trade organization executives. All the speakers warned increased prices were not the prime consideration. Al agreed that the main purpose of the industrial act was to employ more persons at better wages. All agreed that the anti-trust laws of Texas presented a serious problem. <br> Rep. Sumners advised that practical thinking is neces sary and that "unless the people keep their feet on the ground the industrial act plan will fail." Arthur L. Kramer of Dallas predicted that a special session of the legislature would be called soon after Aug. 26th and that "Attorney General James V. Allred will promise not to interfere with the industrial recovery act because of the critica condition which faces the state." <br> Lawmakers made the anti-trust laws and an attorney general is not clothed with power to set the laws aside o order a temporary suspension of the acts. The Texas representative (speaking of Sumners) gave excellent advice to the industrialists and executives. "The greatest enemies to recovery are the get-rich-quick men who are throwing a monkey wrench in the machinery by raising prices with out cause," he declared. "One of the most hopeful signs the willingness and desire of the people to turn autocratic powers over to the president as a means of overcoming the paralysis of business. You cannot revive business until you have revived the debt paying and buying power of 20 mil lion American farmers." <br> He spoke hopefully of the future. He admitted that the powers given to the president are dangerous but said it would have been dangerous not to have given them to him. His prediction: "The president will not abuse that power and will be glad to turn it back when the crisis has passed." <br> On July 1, the president will return to Washington to assume all responsibility and to direct the movements or the functionings of all the plans for the restoration of pur chasing power and prosperity and to provide jobs for the ide- A leader was needed.
