LEGAL NOTICE

PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE REQUIREMENT FOR RECORDANCE AND LIMITATION OF CERTAIN CLAIMS OF WATER RIGHTS.

Notice is here given as required by Section 4 of the Water Rights Adjudication Act of 1967 (Article 7542a, Vernon's Civil Statutes) that all claims of riparian water rights, all claims under Article 7500a, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925 to impound, divert or use public waters for other than domestic and livestock purposes for which no permit has been issued, all claims of water rights under the Irrigation Acts of 1889 and 1895 which were not filed with the State Board of Water Engineers in accordance with the Irrigation Act of 1913, as amended, and all other claims of water rights other than claims under permits and certified filings, must be recorded with the Texas Water Rights Commission. Section 4 does not apply to use of water for domestic and livestock purposes as the same is defined by Commission Rules.

On or before September 1, 1969, every person claiming any water right to which Section 4 applies shall file with the Commission a sworn statement setting forth the nature of the claim of water right. Claims to which the Section applies shall be recognized only if valid under existing law and only to the extent of actual application of water to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1967, inclusive. However, in any case where any claimant of a riparian right has prior to August 28, 1967, commenced or completed the construction of works designed to apply a greater quantity of water to beneficial use, such right shall be recognized to the extent of the maximum amount of water actually applied to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1970, inclusive; provided an additional sworn statement is filed on or before July 1, 1971. Failure to file the sworn statement or statements in substantial compliance with Section 4 shall extinguish and bar any claim of water right to which the Section applies.

Leland Willis, President of Cisco Junior College, has been appointed by the Coordinating Board of the Texas College and University System to serve on the Resident Instruction Formula Study Committee.

This study will culminate in the Coordinating Board's designation of formulas for the 1971-73 biennium in January of 1970. Formulas are used by the public junior colleges in preparing requests for legislative appropriations and by the Governor and the Legislative Budget Board in making recommendations on these requests.

President Willis was one of three college presidents appointed to the committee. Others are Dr. Jean Richardson of Del Mar College and Dr. Wayland Moody of San Antonio College. Representing the Coordinating Board on the committee will be Dr. Robert Clinton and Dr. Ray A. Fowler, both Assistant Commissioners of Education.

The state's Commissioner of Higher Education is Dr. Bevington Reed, former Ciscoan, who was guest speaker at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce Banquet Thursday evening, February 27. President Willis' appointment to the committee came from his office.

All interested persons are advised that reconstruction and improvement of US Highway 183 from its intersection with FM Highway 1032 in Stephens County to its intersection with State Highway 6 in Eastland County is being planned by the Texas Highway Commission. The contemplated location is along the existing highway except for relocations to eliminate poor alignment near the Eastland-Stephens County line. Additional right of way will be secured on either or both sides of the existing right of way when dictated by location or design requirements and new right of way will be secured in the areas of relocation to conform to the latest design requirements. The proposed highway rebuilding of the existing highway to the design requirements for a two-lane paved highway with paved shoulders. Funds for reconstruction of this section of highway have

been approved by the Texas Highway Commission. Plan preparation and supervision & inspection of construction will be under the direction of J. B. Brannan Senior Resident Engineer, Breckenridge Tex.

Brannan stated that the approximate cost of this project will be \$1,000,000 with approximately \$500,000 of the funds being supplied by regular federal aid programs to the State Highway Department. Plan preparation and submission of right of way deeds to the county will be completed after approval has been received for location and design.

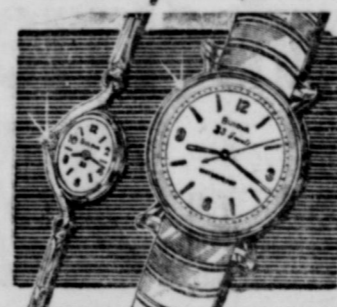

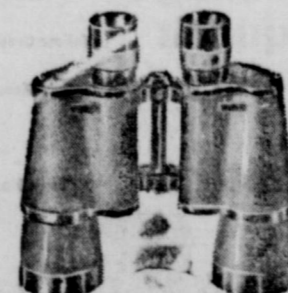
